DENR, muling nanawagan sa tamang pagtatapon ng gamit na face mask

Nanawagansa sa publiko ang Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) hinggil sa tamang pagtatapon ng mga gamit na face mask upang maiwasan ang panganib ng coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) transmission habang patuloy na umiiral ang pandemya.

"Protection against COVID-19 goes beyond following the minimum health protocols and the use of face masks and face shields. Our responsibility extends to the disposal of these healthcare items which are potentially contaminated," ayon kay DENR Secretary Roy Cimatu.

Sa isang press statement binigyang-din ng DENR chief ang kahalagahan ng responsableng pagtatapon ng COVID-19 litter lalo na ang gamit na disposable face masks dahil sa panganib na idinudulot nito sa terrestrial and aquatic animals.

"We have seen that while face masks protect us, these have become the newest threat to animal life because of entanglement, and have added up to marine litter," ani Cimatu .

Samantala, sinabi naman ni DENR Undersecretary for Solid Waste Management (SWM) and Local Government Units (LGU) Concerns Benny D. Antiporda, isang COVID survivor, na mahalaga ang pakikibahagi ng bawat pamilya sa tamang paghihiwalay ng gamit na face masks sa ibang solid wastes.

"We never thought that these healthcare wastes will end up at our doorsteps. Before, these items are just found in operating rooms of hospitals. So, let's put our used face masks in a separate container and properly label it as household healthcare wastes, even specifically indicating it as face masks," saad ni Antiporda sa isang radio program noong isang linggo.

Ayon pa kay Antiporda, pinaalalahanan na nila ang LGUs na ihiwalay ang medical wastes sa paghakot pa lamang para sa proper treatment ng mga ito sa sanitary landfills.

Sa naturang programa, muli din nitong hiniling sa publiko na itigil ang paggamit ng single-use-plastics.

DENR EMB calls for cooperation on waste segregation in Marawi

MARAWI CITY, May 9 (PIA)--As the city government steps up its efforts for solid waste management, the Department of Environment and Natural Resources - Environmental Management Bureau called for the cooperation of residents for waste segregation.

DENR-EMB Region 10 focal person Abbas Lao urged the different households in the city to support the government by segregating their garbage for the effective collection and disposal of solid waste.

Lao echoed his call during Friday's episode of Kalilintad Andaka program of DXSO Radyo Pilipinas Marawi.

"Hinihingi po natin sa mga kababayan natin na magcooperate sila sa program natin kasi one of the very important components of solid waste management is the cooperation of the different household. Yung pagmamanage sa basura natin kung pwede po strictly iimplement nila ang segregation," said Lao.

[We call on the residents to cooperate in our program because one of the very important components of solid waste management is the cooperation of the different households. They should strictly implement the management and segregation of wastes.]

As part of its information campaign, the agency also capacitated the residents in each barangay on proper waste segregation. Segregation garbage bins will also be provided to further boost the waste management in their areas.

The central material recovery facility in Barangay Dulay is also set to be inaugurated this month. This facility will cater to non-residual waste which can be recovered or recycled while the bulk biodegradable waste will be catered through the sanitary landfill to be constructed in the boundary of Malimono in the city and Kasayanan of Kapai town.

With funds from the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management – Marawi Recovery, Rehabilitation, and Reconstruction Program, DENR also procured five quester dump trucks, nine mini dump trucks, two units six-wheeler garbage collector, nine skid loaders, one case crawler-type excavator, one waste handling dozer, one vibratory roller, and two wheel-type excavators. Like migratory birds, let's sing, fly, and soar with nature

LAGUNA, May 8 -- The COVID-19 pandemic continues to impact many countries, slowing down economies and grounding social activities, including work and leisure. The anthropause, or the slowing down of human activities at the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic has afforded us time to reflect on the innate link between human and nature.

This year's World Migratory Bird Day theme, "Sing, Fly, Soar – like a Bird" reminds us to connect with nature and wildlife, particularly the migratory bird species. The theme highlights the "bird song" and "bird flight" phenomenon that people from around the world appreciate, thus, making the conservation of these species a collective endeavour.

Migratory birds are our unsung heroes – they pollinate and disperse seeds, they help regulate pests and diseases; and their majestic beauty enriches the culture in the communities around the ecosystems they thrive in. The diversity of migratory bird species that visit key biodiversity areas play key roles in ensuring the integrity of ecosystems from which we derive vital services, such as food, water, and medicines. Their ability to transcend boundaries make them effective "global ambassadors of nature" for linking ecosystems and strengthening cooperation across the lands and the people within their flyway.

Listening to bird songs and watching them take flight connect us with nature, despite the limited mobility during the pandemic. They have become our "antidote" to the stresses and pressures and scientists are now looking into establishing the linkage between emotional and mental well-being and birds and nature.

Despite the valuable ecosystem services provided by migratory bird species, their population continues to decline and be threatened due primarily to hunting, illegal wildlife trade and destruction of their habitats and important ecosystems. In the ASEAN region, 70 migratory species from a total of 510 have been listed as critically endangered, endangered, vulnerable and near threatened, according to various global data sources. Meanwhile, a study by Ding Li Yong, et al, an international team of conservationists and researchers, says "at least 180 species" along the East Asia-Australasia Flyway are being hunted and trapped for food and illegally traded as pets.

It is important to recognise the intricate link between migratory bird species and the well-being of the people. A study by the Asian Development Bank emphasises that more often, the total economic benefits derived from keeping the species alive in their natural habitats, in terms of their ecological functions and ecotourism contribution, among others, outweigh the monetary value that may be obtained from their direct use in illegal trade.

The ASEAN Centre for Biodiversity has been engaged in various conservation and education programmes in support of the ASEAN Member States (AMS). The ASEAN Heritage Parks (AHP) Programme for one, strives to protect and manage the ecosystems that serve as important feeding and watering sites of migratory birds such as the Indawgyi Wildlife Sanctuary park and Meinmahla Kyun Wildlife Sanctuary in Myanmar; Tubbataha Reef Natural Park in the Philippines; and Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve in Singapore. The AHP Programme supports the capacity development of the park management – providing assistance in training and equipment that can aid in their patrolling and law enforcement – as well as providing alternative livelihood support for the communities around the AHPs.

With the ASEAN region at the heart of the East Asian-Australasian Flyway, the ASEAN Flyway Network (AFN) was established with the aim to facilitate cooperation among the member states, flyway site managers, and local, national, and international partners on the conservation of wetland habitats and migratory waterbirds. With the support from the government of Japan through the Japan-ASEAN Integration Fund, studies have been conducted in designated and potential flyway sites to augment the data needed to scale up migratory bird species conservation measures in the region.

The essence of the World Migratory Bird Day celebration is to link and unite stakeholders to a common goal of conserving ecosystems and protecting migratory bird species. The ACB joins this important global event and remains fully committed to supporting the AMS and fostering regional and international collaboration to ensure the survival of migratory bird species.

Let us allow the birds to sing their songs, soar freely, and thrive without threats to their existence. Let us recognise and treasure our wonderful connection, and fortify our resolve to continue to protect and conserve biodiversity.

This World Migratory Bird Day, let us "Sing, Fly, Soar -- like a Bird!"

DOE, UNDP discuss continuing partnerships on renewable energy dev't and climate finance in PH

TAGUIG CITY, May 8 -- Energy Secretary Alfonso G. Cusi and United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) Resident Representative Selva Ramachandran on Tuesday (May 4) discussed the continuing partnerships on Renewable Energy development and Climate Finance in the Philippines.

During the virtual meeting, Energy Undersecretary Emmanuel P. Juaneza informed the Secretary that the UNDP has extended the Development for Renewable Energy Applications Market Mainstreaming and Sustainability (DREAMS) Project's duration from July 2021 to January 2023.

In his remarks, Secretary Cusi emphasized the need for the Department of Energy (DOE) and UNDP to work together towards Climate Justice. This includes securing investments to attain the policy directive on 100% household electrification by 2022, and crafting policies and programs that will eventually lead to increase utilization of renewable energy and lower cost of electricity among household consumers. Further warming promotes emergence of infectious diseases

MANILA – Two experts have raised the urgency for mitigating greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, warning that more infectious diseases would emerge if global warming intensifies.

"The latest climate science already warned us that (a) higher degree of global warming would lead to (the) emergence of new infectious diseases," Climate Change Commission (CCC) Vice Chairperson and Executive Director Emmanuel de Guzman told participants of the climate change expenditure-tagging webinar organized for local government units (LGUs) nationwide by the commission and the Department of the Interior and Local Government and held this month.

De Guzman said GHG emissions are further warming the Earth and changing the climate, as these discharges continue to accumulate in the atmosphere and trap heat.

Scientist and University of the Philippines professor, Dr. Rodel Lasco, said new studies indicate disease outbreaks are becoming frequent.

Lasco said scientists attribute the shortening of the interval between outbreaks to the complex interaction among virology, biodiversity, changes in the climate, poverty, food safety, and population growth.

"I hope we can see there's a wider connection out there," he said during the webinar.

Findings of a study he presented during the webinar linked the Zika virus to GHG emissions and climate change.

Earlier, the World Health Organization (WHO) reported an apparent increase in infectious diseases, including several newly circulating ones.

This increase reflects the combined impact of rapid demographic, environmental, social, technological, and other changes, the WHO said.

"Climate change will also affect infectious disease occurrence," it added.

The webinar oriented LGUs on the process of identifying and tagging respective climate changerelated initiatives in annual investment programs.

The process aims to help mainstream climate change adaptation and mitigation in LGUs' target annual budgets.

Difficulties arising from the onslaught of various infectious diseases are among the reasons for making mainstreaming essential, de Guzman said.

"We're now all grappling with the effects of one such disease," he said, referring to the coronavirus disease 2019 (Covid-19), which continues to plague countries worldwide.

De Guzman said countries could no longer afford to further increase GHG emissions.

"Returning to business as usual, therefore, is not an option," he said.


The way forward, he said, is to instead "heed science and make decisive action towards a greener and more sustainable economic system."

The CCC's programs aim to help build climate resilience nationwide and a sustainable economy for the country.

First reported in China, Covid-19 evolved into a pandemic, prompting countries to impose quarantines and lockdowns.

The Department of Health has reported nearly 1.1 million Covid-19 infections in the Philippines as of May 7, with 66,626 active cases. (*PNA*)

Coronavirus cases in Philippines climb to 1,094,849

MANILA, Philippines — Health authorities on Saturday reported 6,979 additional COVID-19 infections, bringing the national caseload to 1,094,849.

- Active cases: 63,376 or 5.8% of the total
- Recoveries: 10,179, pushing total to 1,013,204
- Deaths: 170, bringing total to 18,269

What's new today?

- The government's pandemic task force has <u>allowed</u> point-to-point air travel from the so-called "NCR Plus" area for leisure purposes in a bid to revive economic activity in tourist destinations that took a major blow due to the pandemic.
- The Food and Drug Administration Friday granted a local pharmaceutical company's application to register its ivermectin for human use, paving the way for it to be manufactured, distributed and sold.
- The drug, however, is indicated as anti-parasitic and is still not registered for the prevention or treatment of COVID-19.
- The government needs P20 billion to <u>fund COVID-19 vaccine procurement</u> this year and another P90 billion for next year, officials leading the pandemic response told senators Thursday night.
- Minors aged 15 to 17 and citizens age 65 and above are now <u>permitted</u> to leave their homes, but only to register for the Philippine Identification System, Malacañang said Friday.

Almost 200k Pfizer doses to arrive on Monday - Duque

The Philippines is expecting around 193,000 doses of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine on Monday, Health Secretary Francisco Duque III said Saturday.

Duque said the vaccines will be given to the NCR Plus – composed of the National Capital Region, Bulacan, Cavite, Laguna, Rizal – as well as Cebu, Davao, and other major cities that can handle the temperature requirements of Pfizer.

The largest real-world study of the Pfizer vaccine confirmed that the jab provided more than <u>95</u> <u>percent protection</u> against COVID-19.

However, it also found that the level dropped significantly when people received just one of the two prescribed doses.



According to the Health Secretary, the Philippines is also set to receive 1.1 million doses of Pfizer from the COVAX Facility, 500,000 doses of the Sinovac vaccine, and 2 million doses of the Sputnik V vaccine within this year.

Earlier in the day, the Philippines received <u>two million doses of AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine</u> <u>doses</u> from the COVAX Facility.

The Philippines has reported <u>1,087,885 confirmed COVID-19 cases</u>, of which 1,003,160 have recovered and 18,099 have died. **-MDM, GMA News**

4-magnitude quake hits Mulanay, Quezon

A magnitude 4 earthquake hit Mulanay, Quezon on Saturday afternoon, May 8, the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs) said.



Phivolcs said the temblor took place at about 21 kilometers (km) southwest of Mulanay, Quezon at 1:03 p.m.

The quake had a depth of focus of 1 km and was tectonic in origin.

Phivolcs said Intensity IV or "moderately strong" shaking was felt in Mulanay, Quezon.

Intensity III or "weak" shaking was monitored in Catanauan, Quezon and Torrijos, Marinduque.

The agency also measured an Instrumental Intensity IV in Mulanay, Quezon.

State seismologists said they were not expecting damage to property. They said no aftershocks were expected to occur following the quake.
