Caloocan City cited anew for Manila Bay rehabilitation efforts

The Caloocan City government on Friday, Dec. 17, was named as "Top Performing Local Government Unit (LGU)" in terms of implementing the Manila Bay rehabilitation program.

This is the third time that Caloocan City was recognized in the yearly assessment of the LGUs' compliance with the Manila Bay Clean-up Rehabilitation and Preservation Program (MBCRPP).

The city's latest award from the Manila Bay Task Force and the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) was received by Engineer Maria Numenia Obina, city assessor and concurrent officer-in-charge of the Housing and Resettlement Office, and Ms. Marda Alina Dumaoang of the DILG field office in Caloocan.

Mayor Oscar "Oca" Malapitan thanked the task force and the DILG for inspiring the city to continue improving projects which focus on maintaining cleanliness.

"Bilang mga mamamayan at lingkod-bayan, responsibilidad natin na panatilihing malinis ang ating kapaligiran (It's our responsibility as citizens and public servants to keep our environment clean)," Malapitan said.

The local government said it continues to coordinate with the DILG and the 188 barangays in the city in adopting programs that promote the rehabilitation of Manila Bay and protection of the environment.

The MBCRPP is the DILG's initiative to clean, rehabilitate, maintain, and preserve Manila Bay for a balanced and healthy ecology for the Filipino citizens.

Saving the world from catastrophe: Shifting to cleaner energy

The record-breaking tornadoes that devastated Mayfield in Kentucky and sliced through five other states is showing that the impact of climate change is becoming more severe and deadly. And while the connection between climate change and tornadoes has yet to be clearly established, experts warn that these extreme weather occurrences are going to be our "new normal" – with typhoons, droughts, wildfires and heatwaves becoming more severe due to global warming.

It's evident that no place on earth will be able to escape the consequences of climate change, but the impact will be more felt in highly vulnerable countries such as the Philippines and its fellow ASEAN members like Vietnam, Thailand and Myanmar which are in the list of top 10 countries in the world that are impacted the most by climate change.

The Philippines – which was recently devastated by Super Typhoon Odette (international name Rai) whose impact is being likened to that of Typhoon Yolanda (international name Haiyan) – is sinking at a rate that is four times faster than the global average due to rising sea levels. Indonesia's capital of Jakarta, which is one of the fastest sinking cities in the world, was also hit by recent floods, submerging many parts of the city. About 40 percent is already below sea level, with some areas sinking at an annual rate of 20 centimeters. Bangkok, meanwhile, is sinking by as much as 30 millimeters per year and could be underwater in 10 to 20 years. Vietnam's Ho Chi Minh City, on the other hand, is sinking by as much as 80 millimeters a year.

During a luncheon meeting hosted by the US-ASEAN Business Council with ASEAN ambassadors in Washington and several US energy companies, the impact of climate change on ASEAN member-nations was discussed, and why it is expedient to lessen our dependence on fossil fuels and accelerate the shift to clean energy.

The burning of fossil fuels such as coal, petroleum and natural gas releases carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas that traps heat in the atmosphere, resulting in global warming. In our meeting with Special Presidential Envoy on Climate John Kerry, he warned that the world is headed towards a potential climate catastrophe – but that we can still reverse the dangerous warming of the planet by limiting the temperature rise to 1.5 degree Celsius and reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 2030.

According to Secretary Kerry, there are opportunities for alternative energy sources to reverse the impact of global warming, such as nuclear energy that is the second largest source of low-carbon electricity. Nuclear is described as a "zero-emission clean energy source" by the US Office of Nuclear Energy.

He also talked about small modular reactors (SMRs), whose size is about twice the length of an average school bus and thus are much smaller than conventional nuclear reactors. SMRs are nuclear fission reactors that can be built in a plant and transported to a site for installation. They are flexible, have greater scalability, require smaller investment capital and, most of all, can play a significant role in decarbonization because they produce clean nuclear energy.

One of those who has been advocating nuclear energy and pushing for the revival of the mothballed Bataan Nuclear Power Plant (BNPP) is Mark Cojuangco (who is currently running for congressman of Pangasinan's 2nd District) to meet the increasing energy demand, especially next year as the country intensifies economic recovery efforts. Mark has been warning that the country faces a serious power shortage, and the revival of the BNPP will provide a stable source of electricity that is also less costly.

Director Carlo Arcilla of the Philippine Nuclear Research Institute says the revival of the BNPP is "the fastest route to start nuclear (energy)," warning that the country is faced with a crucial energy crisis in the coming months. According to Arcilla, the South Korean government remains interested in rehabilitating BNPP, and this can be done in four to five years.

Meralco chairman Manny Pangilinan told me he is also ramping up investments in renewable energy projects and securing renewable sources by way of supply to accelerate plans for the "orderly and affordable transition to cleaner energy," to achieve more sustainability and protect the environment.

As I pointed out during the USABC meeting hosted by its president and CEO, Ambassador Ted Osius, energy is a vital component to drive development and sustain economic growth, and this is especially true for the ASEAN region where the energy demand is projected to increase by as much as 60 percent by 2040 in line with the growth of the region, fueled by increasing industrial activities, growing population and rising incomes. ASEAN's rising energy demand has resulted in increased reliance on fossil fuels – which could result in potentially serious consequences for the environment.

We're pleased to note that the Philippine government is signing on to the Clean Energy Finance and Investment Mobilization (CEFIM) program organized by the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development. CEFIM will help the Philippines in jumpstarting the transition goals of the Philippine Energy Plan by providing a clear roadmap and action plan for financing and investing in clean energy.

Our Energy Secretary Al Cusi had admitted that nuclear energy would play a very important role in helping the Philippines achieve energy security, especially in the midst of the pandemic. More and more people are advocating the inclusion of nuclear energy in the country's energy mix, believing that the shift to clean energy will mitigate the impact of climate change – ultimately saving lives of people today and future generations.



Odette exits Philippines; rains to continue – Pagasa

Odette left the Philippine area of responsibility at 12:40 p.m. yesterday but tropical cyclone wind Signal No. 3 remained over the central portion of Palawan, including Kalayaan, Calamian and Cagayancillo islands as of the 5 p.m. weather advisory.

MANILA, Philippines — Even as Typhoon Odette left yesterday, rains would continue to persist over some parts of the country due to the northeast monsoon, the Philippine Atmospheric Geophysical Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) said.

Odette left the Philippine area of responsibility at 12:40 p.m. yesterday but tropical cyclone wind Signal No. 3 remained over the central portion of Palawan, including Kalayaan, Calamian and Cagayancillo islands as of the 5 p.m. weather advisory.

Signal No. 1 was hoisted over Occidental and Oriental Mindoro, Western portion of Romblon, Aklan, Antique, Capiz, Iloilo, Guimaras, the rest of Palawan and Western portion of Negros Occidental.

As of 3 p.m. the center of Odette, international name Rai, was located 55 kilometers northeast of Pag-asa island in Kalayaan, Palawan.

It was carrying maximum sustained winds of 165 kilometers per hour near the center and gustiness of up to 205 kph.

It was moving westward at 25 kph and a slight re-intensification is expected as it moves over the West Philippine Sea.

The vertical wind shear and the monsoon surge will weaken the typhoon starting today, according to PAGASA.

Odette was causing stormy weather over Kalayaan Islands, with moderate to heavy damage to structures and vegetation.

The trough of the typhoon continued to bring cloudy skies over Bicol Region, CALABARZON, Central Luzon and Metro Manila.

Odette made nine landfalls, beginning in Siargao, Surigao del Norte then to Dinagat Islands, Liloan and Padre Burgos in Southern Leyte, Pres. Carlos Garcia and Bien Unido in Bohol, in Carcar, Cebu, La Libertad in Negros Oriengal and Roxas in Palawan.

Meanwhile, the shear line is bringing cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms over Cagayan Valley, Cordillera Administrative Region, Bicol Region, Aurora and Quezon.

The northwest monsoon will bring isolated light rains over Ilocos Region and the rest of Central Luzon.

Isolated rainshowers due to localized thunderstorms are also expected over Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

Southern Leyte 'badly hit' by Odette, governor says

The Province of Southern Leyte that was placed under Tropical Cyclone Wind Signal No. 4 on Thursday (Dec. 16) was heavily damaged by Typhoon Odette, with communication and power lines yet to be restored.

Gov. Damian Mercado said in the Laging Handa briefing on Saturday (Dec. 18) that weather has already improved. However, several houses along the shore were badly damaged.

"Talagang badly hit. Sobra ang damage dito ngayon sa Southern Leyte. Hindi ko masyadong masabi kung ano talaga ang situation ngayong because closed ang kalsada, walang communication, walang kuryente," he said.

"Parang medyo walang lubong na bayan, but ang problema namin kasi all of our towns in Southern Leyte are along the shore, kaya iyong ang medyo malaking damage... mga bahay na [nasa] tabing dagat," he added.

Mercado added that their evacuees have already returned to their homes amid the improvement in weather conditions, but they might not be able to buy goods due to stores being closed.

Food packs have been distributed prior to the typhoon's landfall. But authorities are still expecting a possible shortage of food supplies in the coming days due to the number of people affected.

He said they would also welcome donations from private individuals, including Southern Leyte residents who are abroad.

The province also appealed to telecommunications companies Globe and Smart to immediately restore communication lines to establish communication with municipalities on their needs.

Vaccination

The official said they may skip the second round of the three-day national vaccination drive scheduled for Dec. 20 to 22. This is to prioritize relief and recovery efforts for typhoon-affected residents.

Southern Leyte currently has a vaccination coverage of over 80%. It was also assured that the vaccines were not damaged.

Health Undersecretary Myrna Cabotaje said it will be based on local governments' assessment of whether to prioritize relief efforts over vaccination.

"We will leave it to the judgment of the LGUs, puwede na silang magbakuna even after Dec. 22 kung sa assessment nila ay hindi pa nila kayang magbakuna," she said. – **bny**

31 now reported dead due to Typhoon Odette

Metro Manila (CNN Philippines, December 18) - There are now 31 people reported to have died after Typhoon Odette battered several areas in the Visayas and Mindanao, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) said on Saturday.

NDRRMC spokesperson Mark Timbal updated the number of casualties in an interview on CNN Philippines' *Newsroom Weekend*.

However, Timbal said only four deaths have been confirmed so far. The 27 still unvalidated fatalities are from the following areas:

Cebu province (16)

Mandaue - 7

Lapu-Lapu City - 6

Cebu City - 2

San Francisco - 1

Negros Oriental (5)

Bindoy - 1

Manhuyod - 4

Loon, Bohol (5)

San Fernando, Bukidnon (1)

The NDRRMC said the four confirmed fatalities were from Iloilo, Guimaras, and Negros Occidental.

Meanwhile, one person is missing in San Fernando, Bukidnon. At least three people were also injured, Timbal added.

Ongoing damage assessment

Timbal earlier said in a government briefing that the typhoon damage assessment is still ongoing, with disaster response teams carrying out ground inspections in affected areas.

The Department of Agriculture (DA) also said it is still consolidating data on the storm's effects on the fields.

"Medyo challenging po ngayon ang communication with our regional offices," DA Assistant Secretary Kristine Evangelista said. "Wala pa po tayong exact figure ng laki ng pinsala pagdating sa agrikultura, pero ito po ay tinatrabaho."

[Translation: The communication with our regional offices is a bit challenging. We still don't have an exact figure on the damage when it comes to agriculture, but we're working on it.]

Odette left the Philippine Area of Responsibility on Saturday afternoon after making nine destructive landfalls in the country.

PhilHealth releases new rates for COVID-19 testing

According to PhilHealth, it shall provide coverage, ranging from P800 to P2,800 for plate-based – and P500 to P2,450 for cartridge-based – RT-PCR tests.

MANILA, Philippines — The Philippine Health Insurance Corp. (PhilHealth) announced its new benefit package rates for COVID-19 testing, using plate-based and cartridge-based Reverse Transcription-Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR).

The new package rates are contained in PhilHealth Circular No. 2021-0021, which took effect upon its publication last Nov. 30.

According to PhilHealth, it shall provide coverage, ranging from P800 to P2,800 for plate-based – and P500 to P2,450 for cartridge-based – RT-PCR tests.

The state insurer based the new rates on the revised costing estimates and the price cap prescribed by the Department of Health (DOH) and Department of Trade and Industry (DTI).

PhilhHealth said it will "continue monitoring and reviewing the implementation of its benefit packages to ensure financial risk protection to its beneficiaries."

"These testing benefits are available in PhilHealth-accredited testing laboratories," it noted.

The agency added that a member is entitled to the benefit "following applicable DOH guidelines on priority sub-groups for SARS-CoV-2 testing."

On the other hand, PhilHealth said it will still extend coverage to those who are not yet registered with the program.

Based on DOH Department Circular No. 0374 that took effect last Sept. 6, a price cap was set for RT-PCR plate-based and cartridge-based testing.

Under the circular, the price cap for plate-based is P2,800, and P2,450 for GenExpert (cartridge -based) for public facilities.

On the other hand, the price limit for plate-based is P3,360, while P2,940 for GenExpert (cartridge based) for private facilities "with 20 percent allowable markup."

Over 2.3M COVID-19 shots administered in second mass vaccination drive

Metro Manila (CNN Philippines, December 18)— Over 2.3 million coronavirus shots were administered during the latest three-day mass vaccination drive of the government, the Department of Health (DOH) said Saturday.

In a briefing, Health Undersecretary Myrna Cabotaje reported that a total of 2,369,216 doses were administered from Dec. 15 to 17 in areas that participated in the second round of the "Bayanihan, Bakunahan" program.

"Mga 31% iyan ng ating total target na seven million (That's around 31% of our total target of seven million)," she said.

Cabotaje admitted that the drive was affected by Typhoon Odette, which battered several parts of the Visayas and Mindanao in the past few days.

The government earlier said the inoculation program in regions that would be affected by Odette would be moved to Dec. 20 to 22.

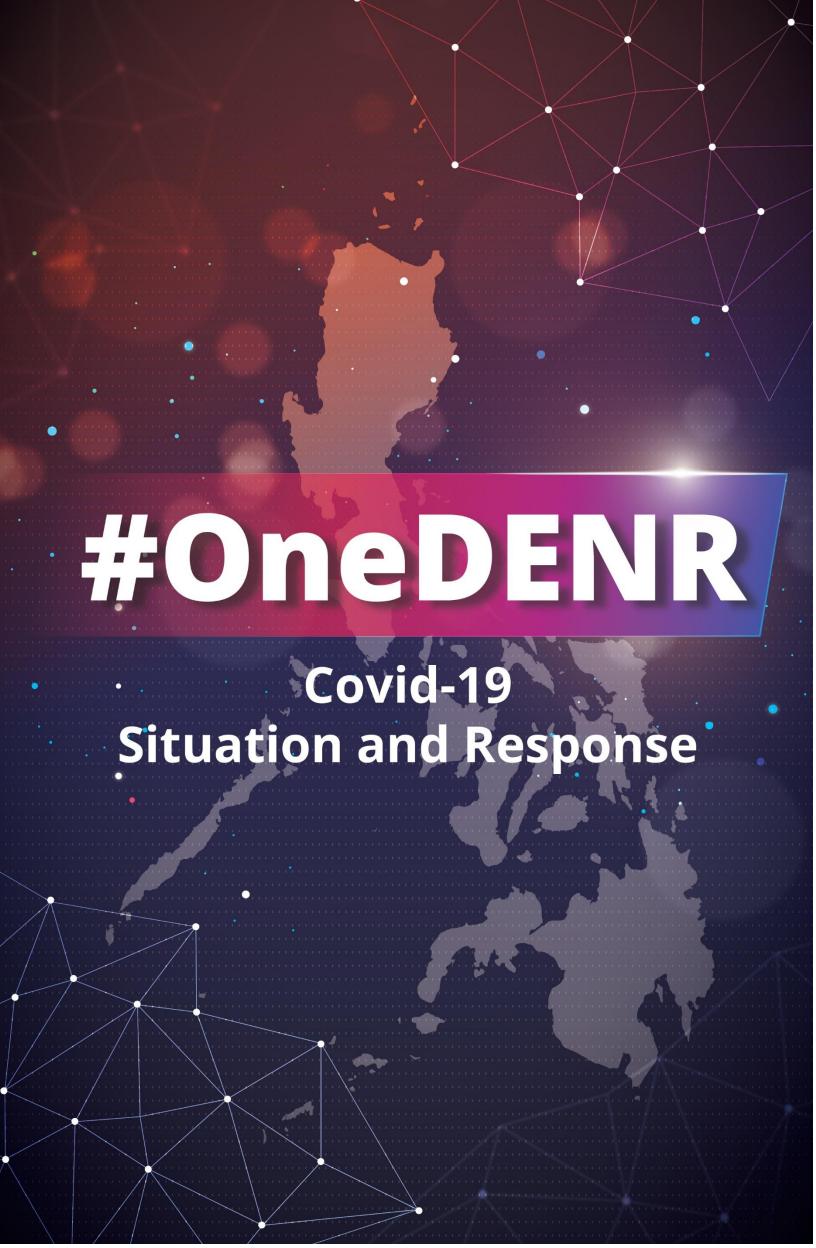




