# DENR vows more aid to areas hit by Typhoon Odette

**MANILA** – The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) has mounted initial relief operations and vowed further assistance to communities hit hard by Typhoon Odette.

Right after the December 16 and 17 onslaught of the typhoon, DENR Secretary Roy Cimatu tasked Undersecretary for Solid Waste Management and Local Government Units Concerns Benny Antiporda to lead relief operations in Siargao Island, Surigao del Norte.

“Rather than prepare for a joyous Christmas, I instructed Undersecretary Antiporda to assess and check the situation there. This is the instruction of the President (Rodrigo Duterte) to me,” Cimatu said during his speech at the DENR year-end general assembly on December 22, attended by 1,600 employees online and 300 at the agency's multipurpose building in Quezon City.

Antiporda flew to Siargao on December 19 to conduct assessment and provide the first wave of aid.

“Initially, we already sent partial relief goods for them a day after the typhoon. Our DENR-Region 11 (Davao) also traveled by land to conduct relief operations,” Cimatu shared in a news release on Sunday.

He likewise urged employees to find ways to extend help to their fellow Filipinos.

"This is an opportunity for those of us who were spared from the damage done by the Covid-19 and Typhoon Odette to commiserate with and assist the victims. I hope that you find it in your heart to extend help," Cimatu said.

The DENR also provided support, particularly cash assistance, to affected communities and DENR employees in Siargao, Dinagat Islands, Cebu, Bohol, Palawan, and other typhoon-hit provinces.

“One thing that saddened me is the plight of the settlers within the shoreline that was badly hit,” Cimatu said. “With this, I will extend all my powers and privileges being the Secretary of the DENR. We will come to their rescue.”



Cimatu promised that the DENR will find a way to resettle the communities.

“To the people of Siargao and all the other victims of Typhoon Odette, the DENR will be beside you in this problem,” Cimatu said. **(PR)**



# DENR commits more aid to 'Odette' victims

The Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) has committed more relief items and other basic goods to the people severely affected by typhoon "Odette".

DENR SEc. Roy Cimatu said they have already conducted relief operations in Siargao Island in Surigao del Norte province but assured that there will be more relief items and cash assistance that will be sent to other areas that were devastated by the typhoon like Cebu, Bohol and Palawan.

"Initially, we already sent partial relief goods for them a day after the typhoon. Our DENR-Region 11 also traveled by land to conduct relief operations," Cimatu said.

He said he had already instructed officials of the department to assess and check the situation in the affected areas.

Cimatu also promised that the DENR will find a way to resettle the communities in time for the holiday celebrations. He also instructed all concerned DENR offices for immediate response and guaranteed support to fellow Filipinos devastated by the typhoon.



# DENR dispute resolution mechanism for land to be rolled out more broadly

AN Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADRs) mechanism will be rolled out more widely after it was piloted in land disputes, the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) said in a statement.

“Although all the cases subjected to ADR pertain to land sector only, the ADR Officer’s expertise is DENR-wide and not in land alone. That’s why in 2022 we aim to roll out the ADR mechanism to other sectors,” LMB Director Emelyne V. Talabis said.

Ms. Talabis said that matters dealing with ADR are not focused on land alone, even though the agency most practiced in dealing with ADRs is the Land Management Bureau (LMB).

In 2016, guidelines on the adoption of the ADR mechanism were issued covering land management and disposition, where they were implemented by 2018.

Since then, 1,020 cases were referred to ADR, with some 281 cases under proceedings.

A total of 739 ADR cases were mediated, with 321 disputes or 43% to the total being settled. The remaining 418 failed to reach a settlement.

“43% is quite an accomplishment and a big leap from the almost zero settlements we had before the adoption of the ADR mechanism in LMB,” Ms. Talabis said.

The proposal is pursuant to the Alternative Dispute Resolution Act of 2004 and DENR Administrative Order 2005-18, which calls for the adoption of the ADR procedures in the resolution of conflict.

The DENR legal affairs office said it does not encourage litigation when dealing with land disputes, as it is often costly and tedious.

“We leverage the environment and natural resources to foster sustained peace instead of litigiousness among stakeholders,” DENR Assistant Secretary Michelle D. Go said. “Sustained peace will hasten the attainment of the development objectives of the department which will definitely have a ripple effect on the societal goals of inclusive growth and poverty reduction.”



DENR Regional Offices in Regions II, V, VI, X, and the Cordillera Administrative Region were among the first to institutionalize the ADR mechanism in their jurisdictions.

The comprehensive ADR accreditation training program has continued through online platforms over the course of the COVID-19 pandemic. — **Luisa Maria Jacinta C. Jocson**

# What is our climate action plan?

After Typhoon Odette (international name: Rai) hammered central Philippines, the damages and losses are staggering. In the latest report by the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council, Typhoon Odette affected 1.1 million Filipinos in 3,238 barangays, claimed 156 lives, and damaged houses, infrastructure, and agriculture amounting to P390,587,949. The typhoon also cut off power, water, and communication lines. At least 12 cities and municipalities were declared under a state of calamity. (Source: Climate Change Commission (CCC) Facebook page)

Until now, there are places with no power, water, or telephone and Internet service. We heard that drinking water is being sold at absurd prices. Recovery will take time, which has always been the case, so sometimes we wonder why we never learn.

In the midst of the destruction, help does not come fast enough. It's a good thing that there are groups and organizations that are working together to be able to bring relief to those who are in need. They still need our support, however, so if we have the means to help them we should not hesitate to do so.

We can be sure that Typhoon Odette will not be the last one to bring extreme devastation to the country. Because of climate change, we should even expect the arrival of more powerful typhoons in the future, which is why preparation is of utmost importance. Shouldn't we—both the government and the citizens—be preparing now?

The CCC explains: As the level of global warming continues to increase, these extreme weather events and other climate impacts are becoming severe, and may be irreversible, threatening to further set back our growth as a nation. The rise in temperature intensifies the water cycle, bringing more intense rainfall and associated flooding, as well as more intense drought in many regions.

It is important to strengthen adaptation actions at the local level in order to build community resilience against extreme climate-related events, says the CCC. Planting trees and propagating mangroves will be beneficial. We must also take our carbon emissions seriously and do everything to minimize or decrease our current levels—as an individual, as a family unit, as a community, and as a nation.

CCC adds that national agencies and local government units must have stronger consideration of climate science in crafting policies and implementing projects and programs for our most vulnerable regions. Companies, businesses, and households have to be more aware of the specific climate risks and hazards in their area. A systems-wide transformation is necessary to climate-proof our future, if that is at all possible at this point. This transformation would require a shift in every aspect of planning and investing for development.

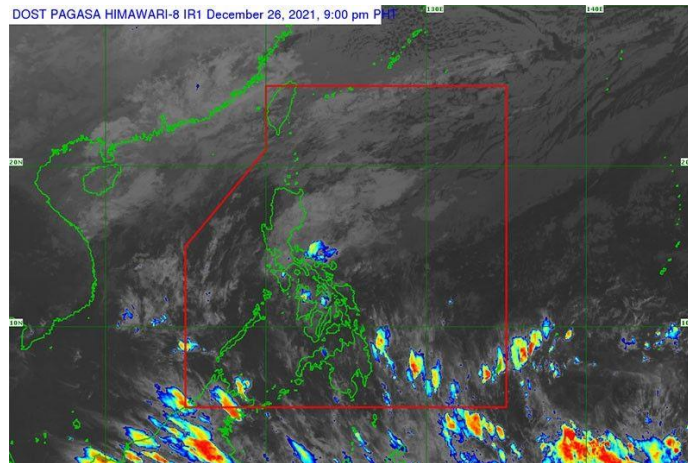

MANILA, Philippines — No typhoons are expected to enter the Philippine area of responsibility in the next five days, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) said yesterday.

However, the northeast monsoon or amihan will continue to affect the country and bring cloudy skies with rains in various parts of the country, especially in Luzon.

In a 24-hour forecast, PAGASA said Cagayan Valley, Bicol region, Apayao, Kalinga, Ifugao, Mountain Province, Aurora and Quezon province may experience cloudy skies with rains. It warned that this may result in possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains.

Metro Manila and the rest of Luzon may experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated light rains caused by the northeast monsoon.

PAGASA said the Visayas and Mindanao may also have partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rain showers that may result in possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms.

# PH logs 433 new Covid cases

THE country logged 433 new cases of [Covid-19](#) on Sunday, the [Department of Health](#) (DoH) said.

The cases pushed total infections to 2,838,640.

The DoH said 4,032 of the total cases were mild and asymptomatic, 3,339 were moderate, 1,777 were severe and 374 were critical.

There were 13 new deaths recorded, bringing Covid-19 fatalities to 51,200.

Recoveries totaled 2,777,918.

The positivity rate was at 2 percent, after 21,116 tests were conducted last December 24. Two testing laboratories were closed on that date, and six laboratories failed to upload data to the Covid-19 Document Repository System.

The national utilization rate for intensive care unit (ICU) beds was 17 percent, 20 percent for isolation beds, and 10 percent for ward beds.

In the National Capital Region, the utilization rate was 17 percent for ICU beds, 18 percent for isolation beds and 15 percent for ward beds.

The DoH again reminded the public not to be complacent against the threats of Covid-19 and to continue the strict observance of minimum health protocols.

It also urged the people to get their Covid-19 shots.



# OCTA: Metro Manila COVID-19 reproduction rate up back to 0.70 amid holidays

MANILA, Philippines — After reaching a low of 0.42 in mid-December, the COVID-19 reproduction number in Metro Manila now stands at 0.70 as of Wednesday, December 22, the OCTA Research Group said Sunday.

The term reproduction rate refers to the number of persons a COVID-19 positive individual can infect. The new 0.70 figure is up from the first week of December from November 29 to December 5, when the reproduction rate was at 0.35. The new number, however, is still well below the critical level of 1.4.

In a statement, the independent pandemic monitor said that the Metro's reproduction number has historically dipped during the holidays possibly due to many people going back to their home provinces for the holidays.

"If we compare this with last year, the reproduction number also spiked before the holidays, followed by a dip during the holidays [and] then an uptick by the first week of January 2021," OCTA Research fellow Guido David said.

"The holiday uptick may explain the increasing reproduction number and positivity rate. On the other hand, a continued increase in the reproduction number during the holidays would indicate a pattern not observed in December 2020."

According to David, the reproduction number in the NCR "based on testing has also increased to 0.79." Numbers based on testing, he said, are a "more accurate measure... because it is not affected by backlog."

This comes after [Metro Manila recorded 201 new COVID-19 cases](#) on Christmas Day, the highest out of any region on that day per data from the Department of Health.

[Within the capital region](#), the cities of Manila, Quezon, and Las Piñas topped daily cases with 58, 25, and 20 new cases for that day respectively.

Outside of the 201 infections reported in the National Capital Region, the next-highest provinces on the list were Cavite, Iloilo, and Negros Occidental with 19, 15, and 15 cases tallied.



"Whatever the case may be, we must continue to be vigilant and practice minimum public health standards as we enjoy the rest of the holidays. People with colds symptoms should be mindful of mingling with other people," David also said.

The entire Philippines is set to remain under Alert Level 2 for the rest of the year.

To date, health authorities have recorded 2.84 million coronavirus cases around the country since the pandemic began. 9,376 of these remain classified as active cases who have neither recovered or passed away.





# Over 1.9-million gov't procured AstraZeneca COVID-19 jabs arrive in PH

MANILA — The Philippines on Sunday received more than 1.9 million doses of the AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine.

The 1,957,000 doses of AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine, procured by the government, arrived in Manila before 7 p.m.

This brings the total number of COVID-19 vaccines delivered to the Philippines to over 200 million doses, of which more than 100 million have already been administered to Filipinos as of Dec. 21, according to the ABS-CBN Investigative and Research Group.

"Another milestone po, almost 208 million doses po ngayon ang ating natanggap na po, ang arrivals po ng bakuna dito sa ating bansa," National Task Force Against COVID-19 Assistant Secretary Wilben Mayor said.

(This is another milestone. We have already received almost 208 million vaccine doses.)

The Food and Drug Administration last week approved the use of Pfizer-BioNTech's jab on children aged 5 to 11 years old.

FDA director general Eric Domingo said the vaccine is 90 percent effective on children in the age group, with "very mild" adverse effects observed.

Government plans to roll out COVID-19 vaccine jabs for children aged 5 years old and above as early as January 2022. The planned dosage will be at 10 micrograms, a smaller amount than what adults receive.
