PH Signs Declaration to Strengthen Ocean Governance in East Asia

The Philippine government, through the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR), has signed a declaration that aims to strengthen green recovery and ocean governance in East Asia at the 7th East Asian Seas Ministerial Forum on Dec. 2.

Philippine delegation head and DENR Secretary Roy A. Cimatu signed the Preah Sihanouk Ministerial Declaration alongside ministers and senior government officials from member-countries of the Partnerships in Environmental Management for the Seas of East Asia (PEMSEA).

PEMSEA is composed of 11 country partners, namely Cambodia, China, Democratic People's Republic of Korea, Indonesia, Japan, Lao People's Democratic Republic, the Philippines, Republic of Korea, Singapore, Timor-Leste, and Vietnam.

PH Signs Declaration to Strengthen Ocean Governance in East Asia



Through the Declaration, the PEMSEA member-countries have endorsed the PEMSEA Roadmap to 2030 as the region's decadal strategic guide anchored on the Sustainable Development Strategy for the Seas of East Asia (SDS-SEA) vision and commitment to Blue Economy.

This is aligned with PEMSEA countries' green recovery plans and programs and key international environmental commitments.

In the Philippines' statement, Cimatu echoed the commitment of the country to the declaration as well as urged other member-countries to champion initiatives on coastal resilience.

"This 7th Ministerial Forum, the Philippines not only reiterates its firm commitment to the implementation of the PEMSEA Roadmap 2030 and the SDS-SEA Implementation Plan 2022 to 2027, but also urges all country partners to embrace the Preah Sihanouk Ministerial Declaration on building coastal resilience to climate change impacts in East Asia and to contribute in advancing the global sustainable development agenda," Cimatu said.

Moreover, the DENR chief highlighted the implementation of "blended protection" to address the "pressure and threats" of climate change to the ocean and marine resources.

"The country welcomes the application of blended protection that includes 30 percent coverage of both land and sea to significantly measure the equivalent effects of protection of biodiversity through strong enforcement of other conservation policies such as the total ban of illegal, unreported, and unregulated fishing, among others," Cimatu pointed out.

He said, however, that there is a need to strengthen collaboration with other stakeholders on the "spectrum of effective area-based conservation measures" and important marine areas.

Cimatu also boasted the Philippine government's efforts in the rehabilitation of Boracay and the continuous restoration program of the Manila Bay, including massive clean-up, construction of solar-powered sewage treatment plants, and dredging of waterways and beach nourishment.

"Such efforts demonstrated the whole-of-government and integrated approach in addressing marine pollution which contributes to the fragile situation of our oceans," he said.

He also noted the adoption of the national plan of action that intends to prevent, reduce and manage marine litter and aims to achieve zero-waste Philippine waters by 2040.

Cimatu said the Philippines has also embarked on sustainable fisheries and aquaculture and invested in green ports that run through renewable energy, equipped with solar panel lighting, and have shore reception facilities.

He also called on boosting programs that will conserve the forest, restoration of land-based pollution, and support emerging blue economy industries.

He added that there is a need to produce the second National State of Ocean and Coasts report that will "measure blue economy" through an economic valuation of ocean-based industries and coastal and marine ecosystems and resources.

"Let us continue to demonstrate the far-reaching effects of our cooperation and partnership for pursuing transformative actions for HOPE—healthy ocean, people, and economies," Cimatu said.

He also extended his congratulations to the Ministry of Environment of Cambodia and the PEMSEA Resource Facility.

The Royal Government of Cambodia hosted this year's EAS Congress and Ministerial Forum, where the member-countries joined via an online platform.

The Philippines has also hosted the EAS Congress in Iloilo in 2018.

"This pandemic enables the people to reflect and think about their lives in the future. Therefore, this is also the best time to educate them about how their consumption behaviors affect climate change," DENR Secretary Roy Cimatu said.

Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Secretary Roy Cimatu said the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic should serve as a moment of reflection to "re-focus" and "re-think" climate change mitigation efforts, especially to limit changes driven by human activities just weeks after global climate talks concluded.

"With the recent developments during the 26th United Nations Climate Change Conference or Conference of the Parties (COP26) in Glasgow, Scotland, it is also time to make more and more people aware of our commitments on climate change," Cimatu said in a press release.

"This pandemic enables the people to reflect and think about their lives in the future. Therefore, this is also the best time to educate them about how their consumption behaviors affect climate change," the secretary added.

DENR Undersecretary for Finance, Information Systems and Climate Change Atty. Analiza Rebuelta-Teh said the lockdowns brought by the pandemic is the "time to limit climate change as we also face the challenges of urgently addressing the ongoing Covid-19 pandemic."

"The conclusions in the Intergovernmental Panel for Climate Change or IPCC's 6th report demand collective action to transform our economy, our behavior, and our lifestyle at all levels: individuals, communities, businesses, institutions, and governments," Teh said in her opening message during the public webinar, "Code Red: The State of Climate and Humanity," conducted on November 23.

According to the report, climate change will be "bringing multiple different changes in the different regions which will all increase with further warming."

At least 160 participants and representatives from various environmental and climate change youth groups and organizations, and academic science clubs attended the webinar, which was held via Zoom platform and streamed live via Facebook.

John Leo Algo, member of the Interim Secretariat and deputy executive director for programs and campaigns of Aksyon Klima Pilipinas, presented the "IPCC Sixth Assessment Report: The Physical Science Basis," which was the highlight of the webinar.

DENR representatives from various sectors also presented the implications of climate change to the country's environment and natural resources, including biodiversity, forestry, air, water, waste and water resources.

Endangered sea turtle rescued in Pampanga

A CONCERNED citizen of Lubao town in Pampanga recently turned over to the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) provincial office an endangered Olive ridley sea turtle Lepidochelys

olivacea.

Local fisher Nimrod Castro of Barangay San Jose found the turtle caught in his nylon fishing net while sailing along the tributary of Pampanga River, between the boundary of Hermosa in Bataan, and Lubao town. He immediately took it for temporary custody.

Laudemir Salac, chief of the DENR Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office (Penro) in Pampanga, said the rescued sea turtle had a carapace length of 72 centimeters (cm) and width of 67cm with no tagging.

"Since the turtle was in good health condition, we immediately released it back to its habitat at the Bangkung Malapad in Sasmuan town," Salac said.

in cleaning and rehabilitating Manila Bay are making a positive result," he said.

Moreno encouraged the public to be vigilant in monitoring and reporting any illegal trading and online selling of wildlife to penalize perpetrators who pose destruction to biodiversity and the environment.

DENR records show that the massive public information and education campaign of the DENR has resulted in the rescue of more than 6,000 wildlife species from illegal traders while criminal charges were filed against 24 individuals. Scientist backs calls to cancel tree cut permit

AN AMERICAN wildlife scientist, one of the pioneers of captive-breeding of Philippine Eagles in the country, joined the call to protect an ancient nesting site of the eagle from commercial logging.

Dr. James Grier, professor emeritus in North Dakota State University, said in a statement issued on December 9, 2021 that they support the petition to cancel the tree cutting permit in Mts. Makabol-Alikoson Conservation Area (MMACA), Salaysay, Davao City.

"I and my wife agree 100 percent with the reasons and are fully in support of cancelling the cutting permit," his statement read.

The scientist said that MMACA is a "long-established, productive, and well-studied Philippine Eagle nesting territory" that should stay in its "natural state to the fullest extent possible."

"That would be beneficial not only for the eagles, habitat, other species, and watershed, but also for the people and communities in the area economically," said Grier.

Best known for his work on the American bald eagle, Grier is a world-renowned scientist who has been working with environmental groups for the studies of the Philippine Eagle since the late 1970s.

Scientist backs calls to cancel tree cut permit

In line with the issue, the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR)-Davao granted a tree cutting permit last year to Ling-Ling Wu Lee to allow logging and development in the area.

However, calls from several environmental groups, including the office of Davao City Mayor Sara Duterte-Carpio, moved DENR-Davao to issue a suspension order for the tree cutting permit.

DENR-Davao Executive Director Bagani Fidel Evasco said in a public statement that landowner Lee has voluntarily stopped the cutting of trees due to backlash from the issue.

"The office (DENR-Davao) will also monitor and validate the area with regards to it being a nesting and roosting site of the Philippine Eagle," said Evasco.

CDC to hold 26th recyclables event from Dec. 14 to 16

CLARK FREEPORT—The Clark Development Corporation (CDC) through its Environmental Permits Division (EPD) will be holding its 26th Recyclables and Hazardous Waste Collection Event from December 14 to 16, 2021 in this Freeport.

The three-day event is in partnership with the Environmental Practitioners Association (EPA) and the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Environmental Management Bureau (EMB), which aims to collect various wastes from Clark residents and locators.

Among the hazardous wastes that will be collected are acid wastes and inorganic acids, alkali waste, contaminated containers, non-halogenated organic solvents, Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE), busted lamps or bulbs, inks and dyes, and paint sludge.

CDC and DENR-accredited environmental service providers will also be collecting white goods such as refrigerators, washing machines, air conditioners, toasters, ovens, and the like.

Used lead acid batteries, used oil, used cooking oil, oil contaminated materials, and special wastes such as consumer electronics and health care wastes are included in the list of hazardous wastes that will be collected on the said activity.

The state-owned firm urges all participants who will be bringing hazardous materials to ensure the wastes are leak-free during transport for safety purposes.

Meanwhile, the collection of recyclables such as PET bottles, aluminum cans, scrap materials, white papers, cartons, and all types of plastic will also continue.

Some of CDC's partner service providers that will be present during the activity are Joechem Environmental Corp., Dolomatrix Philippines Inc., Envirogreen Environmental Resources Inc., ADL Envirotechnology Inc., Semirecycling Co., Inc., and Envirocare Management Precision Inc., among others.

CDC was able to secure a three-day clearance from DENR-EMB Central Office to hold this bi-annual event which aims to promote proper segregation and trade of recyclable materials to help address the country's waste problem.

For large transactions or hauling, they may also call CDC EPD at (045) 499 1137 to 38 for the drive-by (locator's area) schedule of collection or on-site (event place) delivery.


Last year, CDC, DENR, EPA, and its partner service providers were able to collect a total amount of P1.2M during the 25th Recyclables event held here.

The Balanga City LGU garnered the highest score in the Fisheries Compliance Audit (FishCA) National Validation, which aims to reinforce the responsibilities and assess the compliance of LGUs to the Philippine Fisheries Code.

The master plan includes strategic boosting of fish biomass and conscientious restoration of a healthy and vibrant natural habitat and ecosystem.

Other LGUs that ranked high among the 34 coastal LGUs in Regions III, IV-A, and National Capital Region (NCR) -- covered by the Manila Bay Clean-up, Rehabilitation, and Preservation Program (MBCRPP) -- during the regional validation include Orion and Samal in Bataan; Sasmuan, Pampanga; and Navotas City.

"Tunay na kahanga-hanga ang limang LGUs na ito na nagpamalas ng matino, mahusay at maaasahang pangangalaga ng kanilang nasasakupang municipal waters na malaking bagay at tulong sa rehabilitation at preservation ng Manila Bay watershed area na bahagi ng kani-kanilang hurisdiksyon," Año said.


The secretary said it is important to highlight the vital role of coastal LGUs in the Manila Bay watershed area in the management of municipal waters especially the remaining resources, which serve various ecological benefits for communities.

He added that Manila Bay continues to be a major source of food or fishery products to wet markets in various LGUs, a source of livelihood to the fishing communities, and a home for marine species.

The LGUs were assessed based on the following indicators: the existence of a Municipal/City Fisheries Ordinance localizing the features in the amended Philippine Fisheries Code; adherence to coastal zoning policies; regulation or policies contributing to fish stock replenishment; initiatives on documenting fish catch, fishing effort and/or other similar activities to assess fish stock or biomass; and, policy and initiatives to combat or prevent aquatic pollution, among others.



NYARE?: What's the deal with 'COP₂6'?

MANILA, Philippines — Global warming and climate change have always been a major concern as rising sea levels, temperatures and intense tropical cyclones pose a threat to vulnerable countries — all while the world keeps up with the demands of rapid industrialization and urbanization.

In the 26th United Nations Climate Change Conference of the Parties (COP26), over 197 countries agreed on a new deal called "Glasgow Climate Pact" to tame the devastating effects of climate change.

Part of its goals is limiting global temperature rise to 1.5°C and curbing greenhouse gas emissions to further avoid catastrophes.

However, environmental activists here and abroad were left dissappointed even with this pact. But why?

What exactly are "climate finance" and "climate justice"? How could the aforementioned help poor and developing nations like the Philippines who bear the brunt of mother nature's wrath?

Is there really something we could do about the situation?


You may have heard dazzling promises attached to the purchase of carbon offsets, that it will <u>save</u> <u>the world's forests</u> and <u>reduce greenhouse gases</u>, while delivering economic benefits. These promises suggest that if you buy enough carbon credits, you have done your part and are excused from having to worry about the existential threat that is climate change.

But should you really be sleeping more soundly simply because you have offset your emissions? Where I work at, my team and I have thought long and hard about how to approach the climate crisis. We have since come to the conclusion that it can only be solved with behaviour change at scale.

We need to reframe the role of offsets in our collective climate strategy — offsets will never excuse our energy-intensive behaviours. They should instead be treated as one of the tools to be used, while we encourage behaviour change.

DOH logs 360 more COVID-19 infections, 61 new deaths

Metro Manila (CNN Philippines, December 13) — The country on Monday listed an additional 360 coronavirus cases, marking the 20th straight day new infections stayed below a thousand.

The Department of Health said the cumulative tally rose to 2,836,803, where 0.4% or 11,083 are active cases.

Its data showed that of the newly confirmed cases, 348 occurred within the last 14 days, with Metro Manila contributing the highest number at 65, followed by Calabarzon and Western Visayas at 32 each.

Broken down into severity of infections, the DOH said 782 of the currently sick have no symptoms, 4,292 are mild cases, 3,662 are moderate, 1,948 are severe, and 399 are critical.

The department also reported 61 new deaths, but it noted that only nine occurred in December. Others were encoded late, including 26 in November, 23 in October, and three in September.

After final validation, it added that 49 cases previously tagged as recoveries were reclassified as deaths.

Nationwide, the total lives lost to the viral illness now stands at 50,341.

Meanwhile, 519 more patients got well, with the recovery count climbing to 2,775,379.

Based on the bulletin, five testing laboratories did not submit their reports on time, while four did not operate on Dec. 11. These nine facilities contributed an average of 1.7% of all samples tested and 0.8% of all positive cases over the past two weeks.

The DOH also said it deleted two duplicate entries from its data, as well as 147 cases found to have tested negative.
