DENR vows to improve land titling system in 2022

The Land Management Bureau (LMB) of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) has committed to improve the land titling system in the country in order to maximize land use, particularly for the agriculture sector.

DENR Sec, Roy Cimatu said the move is in response to the signing of Republic Act 11573 which removes the deadline for agricultural free patent applications and reducing the required period of land possession.

The Implementing Rules and Regulations of RA 11573, which Cimatu recently signed to improve the confirmation process for imperfect land titles, provides the guidelines in the processing of agricultural free patent applications with the streamlined process to facilitate the land titling program of the DENR.

“Though the LMB has achieved much in 2021, we remain committed to the effective implementation of policies and programs that are responsive to the demands of the public especially in the administration and management of alienable and disposable public lands in the year ahead,” said Cimatu.

For her part, DENR-LMB Director Atty. Emelyne V. Talabis said they will continue to leverage on digital transformation, partnerships, as well as on creating new policies to remain in the forefront of improving the land administration function of the department.

To ease land transactions, she said the DENR has partnered with the Land Registration Authority on system linkage and exchange of land information databases of both agencies to make the registration of DENR-approved plans and DENR-issued patents more efficient and secure.

"The Rapid Land Tenure Appraisal inventory approach is also being conducted by the DENR to get more accurate land data and determine the remaining scope for land titling," said Talabis.

Talabis said the LMB also continues to enhance the Land Administrations Management System (LAMS) being implemented in the DENR regional offices, which include the pilot operation of the Public Land Application, automation of land transaction services, as well as the Inspection, Verification and Approval of Surveys to eliminate red tapes and nuances in the processing of land surveys and titling applications.

A total of 42,146 survey plans using the LAMS Philippines were approved from January to November 15, 2021, broken down into 36,766 survey plans for simple subdivision and 5,380 survey plans for complex subdivision. As of October 2021, the LMB has also served 1,701 requests from its Online Land Records Services through elandservices.lmbdenr.ph.

It also received the FOI (Freedom of Information) Service Experience Award from the Freedom of Information Philippines for its transparency and immediacy in providing the requesting public access to land records and information.

For titling of agricultural and residential free patents, the Land Sector transmitted a total of 15,697 agricultural free patents covering 9,328.3470 hectares to the Registry of Deeds (ROD) from January to October 31, 2021, while 21,824 residential free patents were transmitted to the ROD covering 575.8309 hectares.

Amid pandemic, Cimatú rallies DENR to extend help to typhoon survivors

Secretary Roy A. Cimatú urged employees of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) to come together and find ways to extend help to fellow Filipinos affected by Super typhoon Odette.

"This is an opportunity for those of us who were spared from the damage done by the Covid-19 and Typhoon Odette to commiserate with and assist the victims. I hope that you find it in your heart to extend help," Cimatú said in a news statement.

The DENR chief first made the call during the 2021 DENR Yearend Employees' General Assembly on December 22, 2021, which was held at the DENR Multi-purpose building. The event was also launched online via Zoom.

Some 1,600 employees attended the event with 300 on-site and 1,300 via Zoom.

"During difficult times, we should come together and let the *bayanihan* spirit come to force," he added.

In appealing for support for the needy, the DENR chief highlighted the yearend assembly's theme: "Patuloy na Malasakit at Pagtutulungan, Sagot sa Pandemya Ngayong Pasko."

One of the efforts of the agency is a donation drive for DENR employees whose families were severely affected by typhoon Odette. This will be led by the DENR Association of Career Executives (DENR-ACE), Kalipunan ng mga Kawani sa Kagawaran ng Kalikasan (K4), and DENR Employees Union (DENREU).

Cimatu has already ordered the DENR Executive Committee to ensure that support will be brought to the affected employees in Visayas and Mindanao.

During the DENR Yearend Assembly, Cimatu turned over the cash donations to K4 on behalf of the DENR-ACE for the typhoon Odette relief efforts.

The DENR, on the other hand, also donated the cash prizes intended for the event for the same cause.

K4 national president and Land Management Bureau-DENREU president Atty. Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Pimentel has assured that updates will be provided on how the funds were spent in the affected areas.

According to Pimentel, the K4—through its different chapters—is already “starting a donation drive in several areas of Visayas and Mindanao.

The DENR has mounted initial relief operations and vowed further assistance to communities hit hard by Supertyphoon Odette.

To recall, Benny Antiporda flew to Siargao in the immediate aftermath of Supertyphoon Odette on December 19 to conduct an assessment and provide the first wave of aid to affected communities.

The DENR chief has committed to providing cash assistance to affected communities and DENR employees in Siargao, Dinagat Islands, Cebu, Bohol, Palawan, and other typhoon-hit provinces.

“One thing that saddened me is the plight of the settlers within the shoreline that was badly hit,” Cimatu said.

“With this, I will extend all my powers and privileges being the Secretary of the DENR. We will come to their rescue,” he added.

Some animals transferred to upgraded homes in newly-renovated Manila Zoo

Some animals have already been transferred to their new homes at the newly-renovated Manila Zoo.

According to Oscar Oida's report on "24 Oras," Monday, among those that have been moved include the Brahminy Kites, Purple Swamp Hens, Collared Doves, and Spotted Doves.

Other animals will also be brought soon including the tigers, lions, deer, and hebras (hybrid of horse and zebra). However, veterinarian Dr. Chip Domingo said it takes lots of preparation.

"Kailangan ikokondisyon mo. Kailangan hindi masyadong painitan. Normally, either sa umagang-umaga or bandang hapon. Yung 'di masyadong mainit," he said. "Kailangan safety first."

The Manila Zoo is now in its last stage of renovation and the people in charge have made sure that it will be world-class and live up to international standards.

Aside from new design and amenities, the animals' homes are also made more presentable, strong, and fitted with bulletproof glasses, said Public Recreation Bureau of Manila's director, Alipio Morabe, Jr.

"We went to Singapore, nag-inspection kami at nag-arrive kami sa ganito. Nag-hire kami ng magagaling na architect para at least, magaya o malagpasan namin ang Singapore Zoo," Morabe said.

A 2,000-square meter aviary will also house birds like peacocks.

Of course, the Manila Zoo wouldn't be complete without the now 49-year-old Mali the elephant.

Manila Mayor Isko Moreno earlier said that the Manila Zoo will hold its [soft opening on December 30](#). It will hopefully open to the public by the second quarter of 2022.

Considered as the last patch of green in the City of Manila, the Arroceros Forest Park will be reopened to the public next year following the completion of development projects there like walkways.

The "last lung" of Manila, which the previous administration nearly sold, will open its gates anew following the reopening of the Manila Zoo, the inauguration of the Binagong Ospital ng Maynila and the socialized housing projects Tondominium 1 and 2.

The Arroceros Forest Park boasts of old trees and numerous varieties of rare plants and flowers. In November, a group of environmentalists toured the park to see how to best preserve the ecological enclave.

Manila Zoo will have a soft opening on 30 December for the families of the thousands of construction workers involved in its renovation.

A "media day" will follow before the zoo's opening to the public. Entrance fee will be P100 per head and the number of visitors will be limited based on the Covid-19 guidelines of the government.

City Hall said that the aging elephant Mali remains in good health condition, according to veterinarians. It added that the elephant has a bigger space to move around and play in the renovated zoo.

Experts have cautioned against "freeing" Mali in the wild because he has already grown accustomed to zoo life.

Newly listed Solar Philippines begins construction of Nueva Ecija plant

MANILA - Solar Philippines Nueva Ecija Corp (SPNEC) has started the construction of the first phase of what could be the largest solar project in Southeast Asia.

The proceeds of its P2.7 billion IPO will be used to construct the first 50 MW and the interconnection facilities for the full 500 MW project as well as to acquire the land for further expansion, the company told the stock exchange on Monday.

SPNEC said the first 50 MW is expected to begin contributing power to the grid by the end of 2022.

The project, to be installed in Peñaranda, a 4th class municipality in Nueva Ecija, is expected to create over 5,000 jobs during construction and over 500 jobs once operational, the company said.

"The company is investing in training locals in solar panel installation, given the expected scale of projects in this area over the coming years," the statement said.

SPNEC said the Department of Energy envisions to source 35 percent of the country's energy from renewable sources by 2030, which means there is a need to build over 20,000 MW of solar power.

As of December 2020, the country has a total operating solar capacity of 1,021 MW.

World Bank backs wind power devt

OFFSHORE wind projects can become a pillar of the Philippines' clean energy future, an executive of the World Bank Group (WBG) said.

"We believe that, with deliberate efforts, offshore wind can become a pillar of Philippines' clean energy future," Jie Tang, WBG Energy Practice Manger for East Asia and Pacific Region, said during the consultation on the Offshore Roadmap for the Philippines held by the Department of Energy and World Bank Group in early December.

More than 150 representatives from the public and private sectors, including those from the global offshore wind industry attended the consultation.

Jie praised the Philippine government's efforts in raising the climate action ambition on the country's Nationally Determined Contributions, increasing renewable energy targets in the recently published Philippine Energy Plan for 2020-2040, and participating in a new pilot program for the early retirement of coal-fired power plants.

New climate agreement will force a rethink of PH energy policy



World Bank backs wind power devt

The webinar presented the preliminary findings on the Offshore Wind Roadmap for the Philippines, which included the technical, economic, environmental, social, employment and financing aspects of establishing offshore wind power projects in the Philippines.

The roadmap also assesses offshore wind's potential role in the country's future electricity mix and presents practical pathways to deliver a pipeline of bankable projects.

Energy Undersecretary Felix William Fuentebella said offshore wind can help the country achieve key objectives. "This study will help the DoE (Department of Energy) power the Filipino economy through clean, cost effective, financeable technology that will also create new local supply chain opportunities and transform the lives of men and women and the generations to come" he said.

During the webinar, key industry actors and stakeholders were consulted for feedback on the draft Offshore Wind Roadmap for the Philippines.

State of doing business and the goal for momentum

"Through excellent collaboration with the DoE, our partners BVG Associates (with Arup and Puno Law), and many other stakeholders, we have developed our proposed way forward for offshore wind in the Philippines," WBG Offshore Wind Development Program co-lead, Mark Leybourne said.

"It is now time to share that more widely and get further feedback," he continued. Bruce Valpy, BVG Associates Team Lead, shared his optimism about collaborating with the Philippine government and industry players.

"We are keen to help the Government of the Philippines make the right decisions about offshore wind, finding a route to provide consumers with reliable, stable, affordable, and clean power while growing an industry that provides safe, long-term jobs," Valpy said.

"There are challenges to address, but with this positive spirit, offshore wind can deliver much benefit to the Philippines over the next 20 years," Valpy added.

Climate change: There's no turning back now

PARIS: Across a quarter century of [United Nations](#) climate conferences tasked with saving humanity from itself, one was deemed a chaotic failure ([Copenhagen/2009](#)), another a stunning success ([Paris/2015](#)), and the rest landed somewhere in between.

This year's COP26 inspired all these reactions at once.

Swedish activist [Greta Thunberg](#), leading a 100,000-strong march through the streets of Glasgow, dismissed the two-week meet as a "greenwashing festival."

But dedicated experts in the negotiating arena hailed solid — even historic — advances in beating back the existential threat of global warming.

More often than not, observers vacillated between approval and criticism, hope and despair.

"The Glasgow Climate Pact is more than we expected, but less than we hoped for," Dann Mitchell, head of climate hazards at [Britain's Met Office](#), said with haiku-like economy.

Gauging the efficacy of measures announced at the COP26 summit largely depends on the yardstick used to measure them.

Compared to what came before, the first-ever call by 196 countries to draw down coal-fired power, or a promise to double financial aid each year — to roughly \$40 billion — so poor nations can brace for climate impacts, are giant steps forward.

Likewise a provision obliging countries to consider setting more ambitious targets for reducing carbon pollution every year rather than once every five years.

But all these hard-won gains at COP26 shrivel in significance when stacked up against hard science.



The impact of air pollution on child health

NEW DELHI: Air pollution is a global public health crisis and air pollution levels in India are among the highest in the world, posing a heavy threat to the country's health and economy. According to the 2019 World Air Quality Report, India is home to 21 of the 30 most polluted cities in the world. In these cities, air quality can be as much as 10 times over the safe limits of air pollution recommended by the [World Health Organization](#) (WHO).

Why is air pollution such a significant issue?

Loss of life

According to the State of Global Air 2020 report, air pollution was the fourth leading risk factor for early death worldwide in 2019 and is estimated to have caused 1.7 million premature deaths in India in that year. The burden of disease due to air pollution is higher in low- and middle-income countries, causing about 91 percent of premature deaths.

Economic losses

While the hazardous impact of air pollution on health is well recognized, its negative economic impact is less investigated. Lost output from premature deaths and morbidity attributable to air pollution accounted for economic losses of \$28.8 billion and \$8 billion, respectively, in 2019. In India, economic losses from air pollution were equivalent to 1.36 percent of the country's gross domestic product (GDP).



The impact of air pollution on child health

Why are children at higher risk?

According to a WHO report, every day around 93 percent of the world's children under the age of 15 years breathe air so polluted that it puts their health and development in serious danger. Children are at greater risk than adults from the many adverse health effects of air pollution owing to a combination of behavioral, environmental and physiological factors. Some key reasons for this higher risk include:

- Children are more susceptible because their lungs, brain and immune system are still developing and their respiratory tract is more permeable.
- Children breathe more air per kilogram of body weight, so their exposure to air pollution is much greater than adults. The consequences of their exposure — through inhalation, ingestion, or in utero — can lead to illness and other lifetime health burdens.

What are the effects of air pollution on children's health and development?

Air pollution is one of the leading threats to child health, globally accounting for almost one in 10 deaths in children under 5 years of age. Around 8.8 percent of deaths in children under the age of 5 in India in 2017 can be attributed to air pollution, according to a Lancet study. Some effects on children's health and development include:

1. Serious respiratory illnesses

Air pollution causes more than 50 percent of acute lower respiratory infections in children under 5 years of age in low- and middle-income countries. It can lead to asthma, childhood cancers, chronic diseases, poor lung function, pneumonia and other types of acute lower respiratory infection.

This study from Delhi observed a statistically significant positive association between air pollution (PM10 level) and the prevalence of lower respiratory tract symptoms. These symptoms were more prevalent in girls than in boys. Every third child in Delhi has impaired lungs due to the high level of pollutants that are present in the city's air.

2. Premature births, infant deaths and a negative impact on child growth

Pregnant women exposed to polluted air are more likely to give birth prematurely and have small, low birth-weight children. A recent study from India revealed a negative impact of exposure to air pollution during the first trimester of pregnancy on child growth indicators.

Air pollution contributed to nearly 5,00,000 infant deaths worldwide in 2019. In India, a fifth of neonatal deaths from all causes can be attributed to air pollution.

This Lancet study indicates a plausible link between air pollution and stunting in children.

3. Negative impacts on children's neurodevelopment

Prolonged exposure to polluted air negatively impacts neurodevelopment in children. According to the WHO, new research has shown an association between prenatal exposure to high levels of air pollution and developmental delay at age 3, as well as psychological and behavioral problems later on, including symptoms of attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, anxiety and depression. Air pollution affects children's learning process by exacerbating respiratory illnesses, fatigue, school absenteeism and attention problems.

What is the way forward?

India has taken the following steps at the central and state levels to control pollution and improve air quality:

1. [National Clean Air Program](#)

The government of India's National Clean Air Program is a powerful step in acknowledging and resolving the problem of deteriorating air quality. It is a national-level strategy to tackle the country's air pollution challenge, calling for a 20- to 30-percent reduction in particulate matter pollution by 2024.

2. Performance-based funds transfers to cities

In 2020, the central government allocated approximately \$1.7 billion to fight air pollution in 42 Indian cities that have a population of more than 1 million. This is conditional on these cities reducing their air pollution levels by 15 percent every year. It is the world's first performance-based fiscal transfer funding program for air quality management in cities.

3. Coordinated action to improve air quality

Parliament approved a law in August 2021 to establish the [Commission of Air Quality Management](#) for better coordination, research, identification and resolution of problems related to air quality in the National Capital Region and adjoining areas.

However, much more needs to be done. The air pollution challenge in India is inherently multisectoral. Policies and investments supporting cleaner transport, power generation and industry; energy-efficient homes and better municipal waste management will reduce key sources of outdoor air pollution. Experiences in tackling air pollution in cities suggest three possible ways forward:

- Disseminating information about the problem and health risks.
- Providing incentives to cities/states and other stakeholders for tackling air pollution.
- Building institutions that support air quality management. This requires sufficient funding and a sustained focus on capacity building.



The impact of air pollution on child health

The right combination of political will, appropriate implementation and a strong compliance mechanism from both government and the private sector are required to move forward. Given Prime Minister [Narendra Modi](#)'s recent announcement that India aims to achieve net-zero carbon emissions by 2070, the time to act is now.

Each Odette-hit province to receive P20 million in livelihood aid — DTI

Provinces affected by Typhoon Odette will receive livelihood assistance from the Department of Trade and Industry, Secretary Ramon Lopez said Monday night.

In President Rodrigo Duterte's weekly Talk to the People briefing, Lopez said they plan to give P8,000 to P10,000 in livelihood assistance to 2,000 micro entrepreneur beneficiaries per province affected by Odette.

"On the part of DTI, 'yong moving forward po sa amin 'yong pagbigay ng kabuhayan. In all our visits, nag-assess po kami ng mga kailangang tulungang mga micro SMEs," Lopez said.

(We assessed the micro businesses that needed help.)

"Ang estimate po namin magiging 2,000 ang beneficiary per probinsiya. Kung 2,000 'yan at bawat isa ang programa natin ay P8,000 to P10,000 kada micro entrepreneur para mabigyan ng pangkabuhayan package," he added.

(Our estimate is about 2,000 beneficiaries per province. Our program allocates P8,000 to 10,000 per micro entrepreneur.)

Lopez said each province will be allocated P20 million.

"So total po, P100 to P150 million ang ating magiging initial assistance," he said.

(Our initial assistance will total P100 to P150 million.)

For now, he said, the DTI already has P8.2 million that will be allocated to 300 profiled micro, small, and medium enterprises affected in Siargao.

He added that this week, the DTI will also distribute the livelihood aid to 1,000 beneficiaries in Regions 6, 7, 8, and Caraga.

"Pangsimula pa lang 'to pero sabi ko mag-a-allocate tayo ng P100 to P150 million. Magsimula muna sa P8 million para this week may mabigyan na," he said.

Lopez also said the SB Corporation will get P500 million for microfinancing to help affected MSMEs.

A total of 1,074, 169 families or 4,204,601 people were affected by the typhoon in MIMAROPA, CARAGA, the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao and Regions, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council said. — BM, GMA News

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER NO. 45

**AUTHORIZING THE GRANT OF SERVICE RECOGNITION INCENTIVE TO
GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2021**

WHEREAS, Section (4)(h) of Congress Joint Resolution (JR) No. 4 (s. 2009) authorizes the grant of (i) incentives to reward an employee's loyalty to government service and contributions to the agency's continuing viable existence; (ii) incentives as rewards for exceeding agency financial and operational performance targets to motivate employee efforts toward higher productivity; and (iii) other existing benefits to be categorized by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) as incentives;

WHEREAS, Section (17)(iv) of JR No. 4 provides that the President, upon the recommendation of the DBM, is authorized to update the Compensation and Position Classification System for civilian personnel and the Base Pay Schedule for military and uniformed personnel, as well as policies on and levels of allowances, benefits, and incentives applicable to all government personnel;

WHEREAS, Administrative Order (AO) Nos. 19 (s. 2019) and 37 (s. 2020) authorized the grant of Service Recognition Incentive to government employees for Fiscal Years 2019 and 2020, respectively, in recognition of their hardwork, commitment and dedication to public service;

WHEREAS, the government continues to acknowledge all public servants for their collective and unceasing participation in and invaluable contribution to the establishment of streamlined government processes and responsive delivery of services to the public, especially in the midst of the prevailing public health emergency due to the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, it is imperative to provide reasonable incentives and assistance to our public servants, who are impacted not only by the pandemic, but also by various natural calamities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RODRIGO ROA DUTERTE, President of the Republic of the Philippines, by virtue of the powers vested in me by law, do hereby order:

SECTION 1. Service Recognition Incentive for Employees in the Executive Department. This Order authorizes the grant of a one-time Service Recognition Incentive (SRI) at a uniform rate not exceeding Ten Thousand Pesos (₱10,000.00) for each of the following personnel in the Executive Department:

- a. Civilian personnel in national government agencies (NGAs), including those in state universities and colleges (SUCs) and government-owned or -controlled

corporations (GOCCs), occupying regular, contractual or casual positions; and

- b. Military personnel of the Armed Forces of the Philippines under the Department of National Defense, and uniformed personnel of the Philippine National Police, Bureau of Fire Protection, and Bureau of Jail Management and Penology under the Department of the Interior and Local Government, the Bureau of Corrections under the Department of Justice, the Philippine Coast Guard under the Department of Transportation, and the National Mapping and Resource Information Authority under the Department of Environment and Natural Resources.

SECTION 2. Conditions on the Grant of the SRI. The grant of the SRI shall be subject to the following conditions:

- a. The civilian personnel are occupying regular, contractual or casual positions;
- b. The personnel are still in the government service as of 30 November 2021;
- c. The personnel have rendered at least a total or an aggregate of four (4) months of satisfactory service as of 30 November 2021, inclusive of services rendered under any of the alternative work arrangements prescribed by the Civil Service Commission;
- d. Those who have rendered less than a total or an aggregate of four (4) months of satisfactory service as of 30 November 2021 shall be entitled to a pro-rated share of the SRI, as follows:

Length of Service	Percentage of the Incentive
3 months but less than 4 months	40%
2 months but less than 3 months	30%
1 month but less than 2 months	20%
Less than 1 month	10 %

and

- e. The employees have not received any additional year-end benefit in FY 2021 over and above the benefit authorized under Republic Act (RA) No. 6686, as amended by RA No. 8441.

SECTION 3. Exclusion from the Grant of the SRI. Those engaged without employer-employee relationship and whose compensation are funded from non-Personnel Services (PS) appropriations/budgets are excluded from the grant of the SRI, such as:

- a. Consultants and experts engaged for a limited period to perform specific activities or services with expected outputs;
- b. Laborers engaged through job contracts (*pakyaw*) and those paid on piecework basis;
- c. Student workers and apprentices; and

- d. Individuals and groups of people whose services are engaged through job orders, contracts of service or others similarly situated.

SECTION 4. Funding Source of the SRI for Employees in the Executive Department. The funding source for the grant of the SRI to employees in the Executive Department shall be governed by the following:

- a. For NGAs, including SUCs, and military and uniformed personnel, the amount required shall be charged against the available released Personnel Services (PS) allotments of the respective agencies under RA No. 11518 or the "FY 2021 General Appropriations Act (GAA)";

In case of deficiency, the amount required may be charged against the Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses allotment of the concerned government agency, subject to the rules on modification in allotments under Section 72 of the General Provisions of the FY 2021 GAA, and other pertinent budgeting, accounting and auditing rules and regulations;

- b. For GOCCs, the amount required shall be charged against their respective approved corporate operating budgets (COBs) for FY 2021 only; and
- c. Should the identified funding source prove insufficient to cover the maximum allowable rate of the SRI, a lower but uniform amount shall be paid to all qualified employees of the NGA or GOCC.

SECTION 5. SRI for Employees in the Legislative and Judicial Departments and Other Offices Vested with Fiscal Autonomy. Employees of the Senate, House of Representatives, Judiciary, Office of the Ombudsman and Constitutional Offices vested with fiscal autonomy may likewise be granted a one-time SRI by their respective heads of office at a uniform rate not exceeding Ten Thousand Pesos (₱10,000.00) each, chargeable against the available released allotment of their respective agencies, subject to the conditions set in Section 2 hereof. Should the identified funding source prove insufficient to cover the maximum allowable rate of the SRI, a lower but uniform amount shall be paid to all qualified employees of the concerned office.

SECTION 6. SRI for Employees in Local Government Units (LGUs).

- a. The grant of the one-time SRI to employees in LGUs, including those in the barangays, shall be determined by their respective *sanggunians* depending on the LGU's financial capability, subject to the PS limitation in LGU budgets under RA No. 7160 or the "Local Government Code of 1991," and the conditions set forth in Section 2 hereof, at a uniform rate not exceeding Ten Thousand Pesos (₱10,000.00), chargeable against their respective FY 2021 local government funds. Should the identified funding source prove insufficient to cover the maximum allowable rate of the SRI, a lower but uniform amount shall be paid to all qualified employees of the LGU; and
- b. In determining the amount of the SRI, the *sanggunians* shall exercise prudence and judicious use of government funds, ensuring that the expenditure is reasonable and will not, in any way, adversely affect the delivery of services to the public.

SECTION 7. SRI for Employees in Local Water Districts (LWDs). LWDs may also grant the SRI to their employees at a uniform rate to be determined by their Boards of Directors (BOD), which shall not exceed Ten Thousand Pesos (₱10,000.00) each, chargeable only against their respective BOD-approved FY 2021 COBs, subject to the conditions set forth in Section 2 hereof. Should the identified funding source prove insufficient to cover the maximum allowable rate of the SRI, a lower but uniform amount shall be paid to all qualified employees of the LWD.

SECTION 8. SRI for Employees in Agencies Exempted from the Coverage of RA No. 6758, as Amended. NGAs and GOCCs exempted from the coverage of RA No. 6758, as amended, may also grant the SRI to their employees at a uniform rate to be determined by their governing boards or agency heads, which shall not exceed Ten Thousand Pesos (₱10,000.00) each, chargeable against the NGA's available funds and the GOCC's FY 2021 COB, subject to the conditions set forth in Section 2 hereof. Should the identified funding source prove insufficient to cover the maximum allowable amount of the SRI, a lower but uniform amount shall be paid to all qualified employees of the concerned agency.

SECTION 9. Payment Date. The payment of the SRI to all qualified government employees shall not be earlier than 21 December 2021.

SECTION 10. Supplemental Guidelines. As may be necessary, the DBM shall issue supplemental guidelines to effectively implement this Order.

SECTION 11. Separability. If any provision of this Order is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the other provisions not affected thereby shall remain valid and subsisting.

SECTION 12. Repeal. All issuances, orders, rules and regulations or parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Order are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

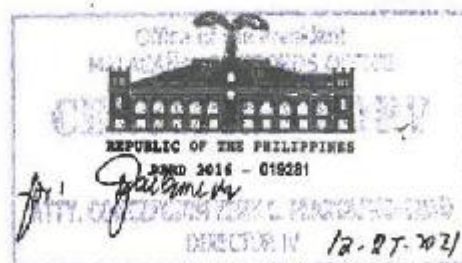
SECTION 13. Effectivity. This Order shall take effect immediately following its publication in the Official Gazette or in a newspaper of general circulation.

DOH sees increase in Metro Manila's COVID-19 cases, positivity rate

MANILA, Philippines — The Department of Health said Monday it has observed increases in Metro Manila's COVID-19 cases and virus positivity rate in the recent week.

"Nationally, the average cases remain lower in the recent week and case classification is still at minimal risk. However, increases in cases and positivity rate in the recent week were observed in National Capital Region and 14 of 17 of its areas," DOH Undersecretary Maria Rosario Vergeire said in a briefing.

According to Vergeire, the capital region remained under minimal risk classification for COVID-19 with a -3% growth rate in cases and an average daily attack rate of 0.69 per 100,000 individuals over the last two weeks.

However, the region showed a positive growth in COVID-19 cases in the recent week at 49%.

The average reported cases in Metro Manila increased by 49% from the previous week, now averaging 115 cases per day.

Vergeire also said the positivity rate in the capital region rose to 1.5% from December 19 to 25 from only 0.7% from December 12 to 18. Positivity rate in neighboring Calabarzon also increased to 0.9% from 0.5%.

The national positivity rate was also higher at 1.3% in the recent week from 0.9% reported in the previous week.

Positivity rate refers to the percentage of people who have tested positive from all those who underwent testing.

"We are seeing an uptick in cases but it's not significant enough yet. But it is an alarm, it is a warning for us that cases might start to increase so we need to help each other out," Vergeire said.

According to the health official, there was an uptick in hospital admissions in Metro Manila, but only 18% of the beds are occupied.

The capacity of the national health systems also remained at low risk.

The DOH reported 433 additional COVID-19 cases Sunday, bringing the total number of infections to over 2.83 million. Of the figure, only 0.3% were active cases. — Gaea Katreena Cabico

Coronavirus can stay in body for months, US study finds

The coronavirus that causes Covid-19, Sars-CoV-2, can spread within days from the airways to the heart, brain and almost every organ system in the body, where it may persist for months, a study found.

In what they describe as the most comprehensive analysis to date of the virus's distribution and persistence in the body and brain, scientists at the US National Institutes of Health said they found the pathogen is capable of replicating in human cells well beyond the respiratory tract.

The results, released online on Saturday in a manuscript under review for publication in the journal *Nature*, point to delayed viral clearance as a potential contributor to the persistent symptoms wracking so-called long Covid sufferers.

Understanding the mechanisms by which the virus persists, along with the body's response to any viral reservoir, promises to help improve care for those afflicted, the authors said.

"This is remarkably important work," said Ziyad Al-Aly, director of the clinical epidemiology centre at the Veterans Affairs St. Louis Health Care System in Missouri, who has led separate studies into the long-term effects of Covid-19.

"For a long time now, we have been scratching our heads and asking why long Covid seems to affect so many organ systems. This paper sheds some light, and may help explain why long Covid can occur even in people who had mild or asymptomatic acute disease."

The findings haven't yet been reviewed by independent scientists, and are mostly based on data gathered from fatal Covid-19 cases, not patients with long Covid or "post-acute sequelae of Sars-CoV-2," as it's also called.

The coronavirus's propensity to infect cells outside the airways and lungs is contested, with numerous studies providing evidence for and against the possibility.

The research undertaken at the NIH in Bethesda, Maryland, is based on extensive sampling and analysis of tissues taken during autopsies on 44 patients who died after contracting the coronavirus during the first year of the pandemic in the US.

The burden of infection outside the respiratory tract and time to viral clearance isn't well characterized, particularly in the brain, wrote Daniel Chertow, who runs the NIH's emerging pathogens section, and his colleagues.

The group detected persistent Sars-CoV-2 RNA in multiple parts of the body, including regions throughout the brain, for as long as 230 days following symptom onset. This may represent infection with defective virus, which has been described in persistent infection with the measles virus, they said.

In contrast to other Covid-19 autopsy research, the NIH team's postmortem tissue collection was more comprehensive and typically occurred within about a day of the patient's death.

The NIH researchers also used a variety of tissue preservation techniques to detect and quantify viral levels, as well as grow the virus collected from multiple tissues, including lung, heart, small intestine and adrenal gland from deceased virus patients during their first week of illness.

"Our results collectively show that while the highest burden of Sars-CoV-2 is in the airways and lung, the virus can disseminate early during infection and infect cells throughout the entire body, including widely throughout the brain," the authors said.

The researchers posit that infection of the pulmonary system may result in an early "viremic" phase, in which the virus is present in the bloodstream and is seeded throughout the body, including across the blood-brain barrier, even in patients experiencing mild or no symptoms. One patient in the autopsy study was a juvenile who likely died from unrelated seizure complications, suggesting infected children without severe Covid-19 can also experience systemic infection, they said.

The less-efficient viral clearance in tissues outside the pulmonary system may be related to a weak immune response outside the respiratory tract, the authors said.

Sars-CoV-2 RNA was detected in the brains of all six autopsy patients who died more than a month after developing symptoms, and across most locations evaluated in the brain in five, including one patient who died 230 days after symptom onset.

The focus on multiple brain areas is especially helpful, said Al-Aly at the Veterans Affairs St. Louis Health Care System.

"It can help us understand the neurocognitive decline or 'brain fog' and other neuropsychiatric manifestations of long Covid," he said.

"We need to start thinking of Sars-CoV-2 as a systemic virus that may clear in some people, but in others may persist for weeks or months and produce long Covid - a multifaceted systemic disorder."
