- The **Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR)** through the *2024 National Expenditure Program (NEP)* intends to apply the sum of **Pesos: Forty-Two Million Four Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand Three Pesos and 40/100 (42,426,003.40)** being the ABC to payments for the first year of the multi-year contract for **PROCUREMENT OF SECURITY SERVICES FOR THE DENR (MULTI-YEAR CONTRACT - CY 2024-2025)** under **Bid Ref. No. DENR-CO-2023-016**. Bids received in excess of the ABC shall be automatically rejected at bid opening.

Once awarded, the winning bidder has the obligation to honor the succeeding year contract with DENR based on the above schedule of approved budget. The DENR reserves the right to pre-terminate contract without liability for reasons of budgetary limitations in succeeding year.

- The DENR now invites bids for the above Procurement Project. **The security services shall commence upon the receipt of the Notice to Proceed (NTP) until 31 December 2025.** Bidders should have completed, within the last five (5) years from the date of submission and receipt of bids, a contract similar to the Project. The description of an eligible bidder is contained in the Bidding Documents, particularly, in Section II (Instructions to Bidders).

*Similar project shall mean **“Procurement of Security Services”**.*

- Bidding will be conducted through open competitive bidding procedures using a non-discretionary *“pass/fail”* criterion as specified in the 2016 revised Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act (RA) No. 9184. Bidding is restricted to Filipino citizens/sole proprietorships, partnerships, or organizations with at least sixty percent (60%) interest or outstanding capital stock belonging to citizens of the Philippines, and to citizens or organizations of a country the laws or



regulations of which grant similar rights or privileges to Filipino citizens, pursuant to RA No. 5183.

4. Prospective Bidders may obtain further information from DENR and inspect the Bidding Documents at the address given below from Mondays to Fridays, 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM.
5. A complete set of Bidding Documents may be acquired by interested bidders by requesting a copy of Order Form via email at bac.co@denr.gov.ph prior payment of the applicable fee for the Bidding Documents, pursuant to the latest Guidelines issued by the GPPB, in the amount of **Pesos: Twenty-five thousand (P25,000.00)**. The Procuring Entity shall allow the bidder to present its proof of payment for the fees in person.

Section II. Instructions to Bidders



1. Scope of Bid

The Procuring Entity, **Department of Environment and Natural Resources-Central Office**, wishes to receive Bids for the **PROCUREMENT OF SECURITY SERVICES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES (DENR) (MULTI-YEAR CONTRACT – CY 2024-2025)**, with identification number **DENR-CO-2023-016**.

The Procurement Project (referred to herein as “Project”) is composed of **One (1) Lot**, the details of which are described in Section VII (Technical Specifications).

2. Funding Information

2.1. The GOP through the source of funding as indicated below for **2024** in the amount of Pesos: **Forty-Two Million Four Hundred Twenty-Six Thousand Three Pesos and 40/100 (PhP42,426,003.40)** for the 1st year of the multi-year contract.

2.2. The source of funding is **NGA, National Expenditure Program**.

3. Bidding Requirements

The Bidding for the Project shall be governed by all the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including its Generic Procurement Manuals and associated policies, rules and regulations as the primary source thereof, while the herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source thereof.

Any amendments made to the IRR and other GPPB issuances shall be applicable only to the ongoing posting, advertisement, or **IB** by the BAC through the issuance of a supplemental or bid bulletin.

The Bidder, by the act of submitting its Bid, shall be deemed to have verified and accepted the general requirements of this Project, including other factors that may affect the cost, duration and execution or implementation of the contract, project, or work and examine all instructions, forms, terms, and project requirements in the Bidding Documents.

4. Corrupt, Fraudulent, Collusive, and Coercive Practices

The Procuring Entity, as well as the Bidders and Suppliers, shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement and execution of the contract. They or through an agent shall not engage in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, and obstructive practices defined under Annex “I” of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 or other integrity violations in competing for the Project.

5. Eligible Bidders

5.1. Only Bids of Bidders found to be legally, technically, and financially capable will be evaluated.

5.2. Foreign ownership exceeding those allowed under the rules may participate pursuant to:

- i. When a Treaty or International or Executive Agreement as provided in Section 4 of the RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR allow foreign bidders to participate;



- ii. Citizens, corporations, or associations of a country, included in the list issued by the GPPB, the laws or regulations of which grant reciprocal rights or privileges to citizens, corporations, or associations of the Philippines;
 - iii. When the Goods sought to be procured are not available from local suppliers; or
 - iv. When there is a need to prevent situations that defeat competition or restrain trade.
- 5.3. Pursuant to Section 23.4.1.3 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No.9184, the Bidder shall have an **SLCC that is at least one (1) contract similar to the Project** the value of which, adjusted to current prices using the PSA's CPI, must be at least equivalent to:
 - a. **For the procurement of Non-expendable Supplies and Services: The Bidder must have completed a single contract that is similar to this Project, equivalent to at least fifty percent (50%) of the ABC.**
- 5.4. The Bidders shall comply with the eligibility criteria under Section 23.4.1 of the 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

6. Origin of Goods

There is no restriction on the origin of goods other than those prohibited by a decision of the UN Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the UN, subject to Domestic Preference requirements under **ITB** Clause 18.

7. Subcontracts

7.1. The Bidder may subcontract portions of the Project to the extent allowed by the Procuring Entity as stated herein, but in no case more than twenty percent (20%) of the Project.

The Procuring Entity has prescribed that **Subcontracting is not allowed.**

7.2. Subcontracting of any portion of the Project does not relieve the Supplier of any liability or obligation under the Contract. The Supplier will be responsible for the acts, defaults, and negligence of any subcontractor, its agents, servants, or workmen as fully as if these were the Supplier's own acts, defaults, or negligence, or those of its agents, servants, or workmen.

8. Pre-Bid Conference

The Procuring Entity will hold a pre-bid conference for this Project on the specified date and time and through videoconferencing/webcasting as indicated in the **IB**.

9. Clarification and Amendment of Bidding Documents

Prospective bidders may request for clarification on and/or interpretation of any part of the Bidding Documents. Such requests must be in writing and received by the Procuring Entity, either at its given address or through electronic mail indicated in the **IB**, at least ten (10) calendar days before the deadline set for the submission and receipt of Bids.



10. Documents comprising the Bid: Eligibility and Technical Components

- 10.1. The first envelope shall contain the eligibility and technical documents of the Bid as specified in **Section VIII (Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents)**.
- 10.2. The Bidder's SLCC as indicated in **ITB** Clause 5.3 should have been completed within **the last five (5) years** prior to the deadline for the submission and receipt of bids.
- 10.3. If the eligibility requirements or statements, the bids, and all other documents for submission to the BAC are in foreign language other than English, it must be accompanied by a translation in English, which shall be authenticated by the appropriate Philippine foreign service establishment, post, or the equivalent office having jurisdiction over the foreign bidder's affairs in the Philippines. Similar to the required authentication above, for Contracting Parties to the Apostille Convention, only the translated documents shall be authenticated through an apostille pursuant to GPPB Resolution No. 13-2019 dated 23 May 2019. The English translation shall govern, for purposes of interpretation of the bid.

11. Documents comprising the Bid: Financial Component

- 11.1. The second bid envelope shall contain the financial documents for the Bid as specified in **Section VIII (Checklist of Technical and Financial Documents)**.
- 11.2. If the Bidder claims preference as a Domestic Bidder or Domestic Entity, a certification issued by DTI shall be provided by the Bidder in accordance with Section 43.1.3 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.
- 11.3. Any bid exceeding the ABC indicated in the **IB** shall not be accepted.
- 11.4. For Foreign-funded Procurement, a ceiling may be applied to bid prices provided the conditions are met under Section 31.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

12. Bid Prices

- 12.1. Prices indicated on the Price Schedule shall be entered separately in the following manner:
 - a. For Goods offered from within the Procuring Entity's country:
 - i. The price of the Goods quoted EXW (ex-works, ex-factory, ex-warehouse, ex-showroom, or off-the-shelf, as applicable);
 - ii. The cost of all customs duties and sales and other taxes already paid or payable;
 - iii. The cost of transportation, insurance, and other costs incidental to delivery of the Goods to their final destination; and
 - iv. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, listed in e.
 - b. For Goods offered from abroad:
 - i. Unless otherwise stated in the **BDS**, the price of the Goods shall be quoted delivered duty paid (DDP) with the place of destination in the



Philippines as specified in the **BDS**. In quoting the price, the Bidder shall be free to use transportation through carriers registered in any eligible country. Similarly, the Bidder may obtain insurance services from any eligible source country.

- ii. The price of other (incidental) services, if any, as listed in **Section VII (Technical Specifications)**.

13. Bid and Payment Currencies

- 13.1. For Goods that the Bidder will supply from outside the Philippines, the bid prices may be quoted in the local currency or tradable currency accepted by the BSP at the discretion of the Bidder. However, for purposes of bid evaluation, Bids denominated in foreign currencies, shall be converted to Philippine currency based on the exchange rate as published in the BSP reference rate bulletin on the day of the bid opening.
- 13.2. Payment of the contract price shall be made in:
 - a. **Philippine Pesos.**

14. Bid Security

- 14.1. The Bidder shall submit a **Bid Securing Declaration¹ or any form of Bid Security** in the amount indicated in the **BDS**, which shall be not less than the percentage of the ABC in accordance with the schedule in the **BDS**.
- 14.2. The Bid and bid security shall be **valid for one hundred twenty calendar days from the date of opening of bids**. Any Bid not accompanied by an acceptable bid security shall be rejected by the Procuring Entity as non-responsive.

15. Sealing and Marking of Bids

Each Bidder shall submit one copy (1) of the first and second components of its Bid.

The Procuring Entity may request additional hard copies and/or electronic copies of the Bid. However, failure of the Bidders to comply with the said request shall not be a ground for disqualification.

All envelopes shall:

- (a) contain the name of the contract to be bid in capital letters;
- (b) bear the name and address of the Bidder in capital letters;
- (c) be addressed to the Procuring Entity's BAC;
- (d) bear the specific identification of this bidding process indicated in the ITB Clause 102; and bear a warning "DO NOT OPEN BEFORE..." the date and time for the opening of bids, as specified in the IB.

¹ In the case of Framework Agreement, the undertaking shall refer to entering into contract with the Procuring Entity and furnishing of the performance security or the performance securing declaration within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of Notice to Execute Framework Agreement.

16. Deadline for Submission of Bids

16.1. The Bidders shall submit on the specified date and time and either at its physical address as indicated in the **IB**.

17. Opening and Preliminary Examination of Bids

17.1. The BAC shall open the Bids in public at the time, on the date, and at the place specified in the **IB**. The Bidders' representatives who are present shall sign a register evidencing their attendance. In case videoconferencing, webcasting or other similar technologies will be used, attendance of participants shall likewise be recorded by the BAC Secretariat.

In case the Bids cannot be opened as scheduled due to justifiable reasons, the rescheduling requirements under Section 29 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall prevail.

17.2. The preliminary examination of bids shall be governed by Section 30 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

18. Domestic Preference

18.1. The Procuring Entity will grant a margin of preference for the purpose of comparison of Bids in accordance with Section 43.1.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19. Detailed Evaluation and Comparison of Bids

19.1. The Procuring BAC shall immediately conduct a detailed evaluation of all Bids rated "*passed*," using non-discretionary pass/fail criteria. The BAC shall consider the conditions in the evaluation of Bids under Section 32.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.

19.2. If the Project allows partial bids, bidders may submit a proposal on any of the lots or items, and evaluation will be undertaken on a per lot or item basis, as the case maybe. In this case, the Bid Security as required by **ITB** Clause 15 shall be submitted for each lot or item separately.

19.3. The descriptions of the lots or items shall be indicated in **Section VII (Technical Specifications)**, although the ABCs of these lots or items are indicated in the **BDS** for purposes of the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.2.6 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184. The NFCC must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.

19.4. The Project shall be awarded as follows:



Option 1 – One Project having several items that shall be awarded as one contract.

- 19.5. Except for bidders submitting a committed Line of Credit from a Universal or Commercial Bank in lieu of its NFCC computation, all Bids must include the NFCC computation pursuant to Section 23.4.1.4 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184, which must be sufficient for the total of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder. For bidders submitting the committed Line of Credit, it must be at least equal to ten percent (10%) of the ABCs for all the lots or items participated in by the prospective Bidder.

20. Post-Qualification

- 20.1. Within a non-extendible period of **five (5) calendar days** from receipt by the Bidder of the notice from the BAC that it submitted the Lowest/Single Calculated Bid, the Bidder shall submit **its latest income and business tax returns filed and paid through the BIR Electronic Filing and Payment System (eFPS) and other appropriate licenses and permits required by law and stated in the BDS.**

21. Signing of the Contract

- 21.1. The documents required in Section 37.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 shall form part of the Contract. Additional Contract documents are indicated in the **BDS.**

Section IV. General Conditions of Contract



1. Scope of Contract

This Contract shall include all such items, although not specifically mentioned, that can be reasonably inferred as being required for its completion as if such items were expressly mentioned herein. All the provisions of RA No. 9184 and its 2016 revised IRR, including the Generic Procurement Manual, and associated issuances, constitute the primary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract, and thus, applicable in contract implementation. Herein clauses shall serve as the secondary source for the terms and conditions of the Contract.

This is without prejudice to Sections 74.1 and 74.2 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184 allowing the GPPB to amend the IRR, which shall be applied to all procurement activities, the advertisement, posting, or invitation of which were issued after the effectivity of the said amendment.

Additional requirements for the completion of this Contract shall be provided in the **Special Conditions of Contract (SCC)**.

2. Advance Payment and Terms of Payment

2.1. Advance payment of the contract amount is provided under Annex "D" of the revised 2016 IRR of RA No. 9184.

2.2. The Procuring Entity is allowed to determine the terms of payment on the partial or staggered delivery of the Goods procured, provided such partial payment shall correspond to the value of the goods delivered and accepted in accordance with prevailing accounting and auditing rules and regulations. The terms of payment are indicated in the **SCC**.

3. Performance Security

Within ten (10) calendar days from receipt of the Notice of Award by the Bidder from the Procuring Entity but in no case later than prior to the signing of the Contract by both parties, the successful Bidder shall furnish the performance security in any of the forms prescribed in Section 39 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184

4. Inspection and Tests

The Procuring Entity or its representative shall have the right to inspect and/or to test the Goods to confirm their conformity to the Project specifications at no extra cost to the Procuring Entity in accordance with the Generic Procurement Manual. In addition to tests in the **SCC, Section IV (Technical Specifications)** shall specify what inspections and/or tests the Procuring Entity requires, and where they are to be conducted. The Procuring Entity shall notify the Supplier in writing, in a timely manner, of the identity of any representatives retained for these purposes.

All reasonable facilities and assistance for the inspection and testing of Goods, including access to drawings and production data, shall be provided by the Supplier to the authorized inspectors at no charge to the Procuring Entity.

5. Warranty

6.1. In order to assure that manufacturing defects shall be corrected by the Supplier, a warranty shall be required from the Supplier as provided under Section 62.1 of the 2016 revised IRR of RA No. 9184.



6.2. The Procuring Entity shall promptly notify the Supplier in writing of any claims arising under this warranty. Upon receipt of such notice, the Supplier shall, repair or replace the defective Goods or parts thereof without cost to the Procuring Entity, pursuant to the Generic Procurement Manual.

6. Liability of the Supplier

The Supplier's liability under this Contract shall be as provided by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

If the Supplier is a joint venture, all partners to the joint venture shall be jointly and severally liable to the Procuring Entity.

The security and protection of officials and employees is vital in the delivery of effective, efficient and economical public service making it necessary to engage the services of a duly qualified and eligible security agency, subject to the laws and regulations on the procurement of Security Services, for the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

The DENR properties requiring security services are as follows:

1. DENR Central Office compound, Visayas Avenue, Diliman, Quezon City; including Bulwagan Ninoy at the Biodiversity Management Bureau (BMB);
2. Environment and Natural Resources Academy, Carranglan, Nueva Ecija;
3. Secretary's Cottage, Baguio City;
4. DENR Project Hope, Tanza, Cavite;
5. DENR Warehouse, Boso-Boso, Antipolo, Rizal

The DENR Central Office has secured Multi-Year Contractual Authority No. MYCA-BMB-E-22-0000032 issued on 10 June 2022 by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) and intends to employ the sum of **Forty-two million four hundred twenty-six thousand three pesos and forty centavos (₱42,426,003.40)** for the first year of implementation of the project *Procurement of Multi-Year Contract for Security Services for the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR)*. The security services shall commence upon the **receipt of the Notice to Proceed (NTP) until 31 December 2025**.

The Terms of Reference (TOR) for the services of one hundred six (106) Security Guards are as follows:

1. There shall be no employer-employee relationship between DENR and the security guards and other personnel employed by the Security Agency.
2. Qualification of Prospective Bidders in addition to the minimum qualification set by RA 9184:
 - At least five (5) years of experience in providing security services as shown by either a Philippine Association of Detective and Protective Agency Operators (PADPAO) certificate of membership or Philippine National Police-Supervisory Office for Security Investigation Agencies (PNP-SOSIA) license to operate for the preceding five (5) years;
 - Must submit a Retirement Plan to its Security Personnel or employees pursuant to Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) Department Order No. 150-16, Series of 2016.
3. Obligations of the winning Security Agency hereafter referred to as the "Agency."
 - a. Enforce strict confidentiality and ensure that no information on the Department's affairs and activities shall be disclosed to any person or entity that may be acquired/possessed in the course of the performance of services.



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- b. Provide, assign, designate, supervise and control the **one hundred six (106)** security guards, at least **twelve (12)** of whom are lady guards, for the fixed and roving posts determined by the DENR under the schedule provided in **item 6** of this TOR. The Service Provider shall submit to GSD a deployment schedule every 15th and 30th of the month or one (1) day before any proposed changes to the schedule, which shall include the names of relievers for monitoring purposes;
- c. No security guard shall be permitted to render service beyond a period of twelve (12) hours continuously and not more than six (6) consecutive days. A violation of this condition shall be considered enough ground to terminate the contract. As such, the Service Provider shall make available, at its own expense, such number of relievers as may be necessary, who are ready to take over the duty schedules of those regularly assigned guards who either report late or are absent for the day at no additional cost to DENR;
- d. Provide additional number of guards as maybe directed by DENR through a written notice from the Director for Administrative Service and under the same terms, conditions and rate of compensation set forth in the contract of service;
- e. Submit the Curriculum Vitae and/or 201 file and work experience in security operations of all the security personnel to be deployed including the Detachment Commander (DC), Assistant Detachment Commander (ADC) and Shifts-in-Charge (SIC) to enable DENR to determine if they satisfy the requirements.
- f. The Security Guards shall have the following training conducted by the Agency or any other training institution, which in either case, should be accredited or recognized by DOLE, TESDA, DOH, Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), or any similar institution that has jurisdiction on the conduct of the particular training, such as:
- i. The DC, ADC and SIC:
 1. Certified Security Professional (CSP)
 2. Basic Occupational Safety and Health (BOSH)
 - ii. The following specific posts shall have the corresponding *specialized trainings*:
 - Four (4) Roving Guards with *Certificate on Basic Intelligence and Investigation Course* or equivalent
 - Three (3) CCTV operators with *CCTV Operation Training*
 - Three (3) Emergency Response Drivers with *Emergency Response Driving Training*
 - iii. All Officers and Security Guards (SG):
 - Basic First Aid Training/Basic Life Support Training;
 - Customer Service Relation Training;
 - Crowd Dispersal Management Training;
 - Counter Terrorism Awareness Seminar; and
 - Disaster Preparedness & Response (including COVID-19 response).

The proof of required trainings of concerned Security personnel shall be submitted within one (1) month from assumption of duty, which shall be a



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requirement for the payment of billing. Also, these training should have been taken and completed in 2020 or onwards.

- g. Deploy neat, presentable, well trained and thoroughly screened regular (neither probationary nor trainee) security guards licensed by PNP-SOSIA, in proper uniform and identification cards, physically and mentally fit as supported by updated medical certificate and valid National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) clearance;
- h. All security guards shall be subjected to neuro-psychiatric, semestral drug, alcohol or other related tests from government accredited testing centers; and ensure that the security guards are fully covered by medical and risk insurance at the Agency's own cost;
- i. Submit security plans for the following:
 - Regular and special operations including the employees' handbook with company policies and disciplinary measures;
 - Disaster and emergency response;
 - Civil Disturbances; and,
 - Pandemic/Epidemic.

An initial plan shall be submitted to the Director for Administrative Service, thru GSD, upon assumption of duties, which shall be revised to conform to the needs/requirements of the Department.

- j. Submit regular monthly and annual reports of operations to the Director, Administrative Service, through GSD on or before the 5th day of the succeeding month and year as part of the billing requirements;
- k. Rotate, reassign, suspend, terminate or impose disciplinary measures on erring security personnel based on the validated complaints by the Detachment Commander, and shall notify/submit report to GSD, who shall update the Director, Administrative Service;
- l. Notify DENR at least one (1) week before any replacement/movement/termination of assigned security guard(s), unless for justifiable or legal cause/s, which requires submission of a report of the action taken at least one (1) day after the incident;
- m. Hold DENR free from any action or liability arising from any claims of the security guards and other personnel employed by the Agency for benefits under the Labor Code of the Philippines;
- n. Submit evidence of actual payment made to their employees on any increase in wage, social security contributions, or any similar payments as may be imposed by law or competent authority, the grant of which shall be subject to the availability of savings;
- o. Ensure the payment of wages on a regular schedule bi-monthly of each month and other benefits in accordance with the existing wage law and provisions of the Labor Code and their Implementing Rules and Regulations; and submit proof of compliance with legal requirements on the payment of salaries, remittances and taxes as a prerequisite for payment **on or before the 5th day** of the succeeding month, such as but not limited to the following:
 - Billing Statement/Invoice

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- Daily Time Record (Summary and Individual Time Card) generated from Biometric Timekeeping System
 - Proof of actual payment (Salary and Benefits)
- p. Secure a “Certificate of Acceptance of Work” from the Director for Administrative Service, or his authorized representative, as a prerequisite for payment;
- q. Be responsible for any loss or damage to DENR properties, provided that such properties are properly turned over to the agency through the guard on duty. Such loss or damage shall not include those caused by force majeure or fortuitous events, such as earthquake, typhoon, war, rebellion, excluding strikes and pickets, provided that the same is reported to DENR within twenty-four (24) hours from occurrence thereof. Provided however that any amount of damages or property losses, as may be determined by DENR, shall be deducted from the collectible amount due to the Agency; and
